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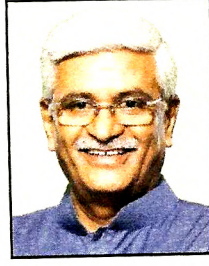

Executive Summary

1. The India Tourism Data Compendium 2026 is the 67th annual edition published by the Ministry of Tourism.
2. It has been compiled using data sourced from a diverse group of stakeholders, such as the Bureau of Immigration, UN Tourism, Archaeological Survey of India, State and Union Territory Administrations, and the Reserve Bank of India.
3. The publication provides an overview of India's tourism statistics with detailed insights into the following key indicators:
 - a. World Tourism Scenario
 - b. Inbound Tourism
 - c. Outbound Tourism
 - d. Domestic Tourism
 - e. State Tourism Performance Framework
 - f. Economic Indicators
4. It includes detailed statistics on tourist volumes, gender and age distribution, nationality profiles, travel trends, purpose of visit, average duration of stay (where exit data is available), modes of entry (air, land, and water), major entry ports, state-wise tourist arrivals, year-on-year growth—providing valuable insights into the evolving dynamics of India's tourism landscape.
5. The salient features of the report are as summarized below:

World Tourism Scenario and Global Indices on Tourism

- According to UN Tourism, International tourist arrivals worldwide reached 15,340

lakhs in 2025, reflecting a 4.92% increase over the previous year. The global outlook highlights tourism's critical role in economic diversification, especially in emerging economies. In line with this global trend, India's tourism sector has also witnessed significant growth, becoming a major driver of the national economy.

- India has positioned itself prominently within the global tourism landscape, accounting for 1.31% of total international arrivals and contributing 1.68% to worldwide tourism receipts.
- The top 15 ITA source countries worldwide are United States, Spain, United Kingdom, France, Italy, Japan, Turkey, UAE, Australia, China, Canada, Thailand, Germany, Saudi Arabia and India.
- Global Tourism rankings published by the World Economic Forum in their biennial Travel and Tourism Development Index (TTDI) 2024, India has been placed at the 39th rank, reflecting the sector's post-pandemic recovery and performance. Notably, India is one of only three countries to score in the top 10 across all resource pillars—6th in Natural Resources, 9th in Cultural Resources, and 9th in Non-Leisure Resources. The country also excels in price competitiveness (18th) and infrastructure, with strong rankings in Air Transport (26th) and Ground and Port Infrastructure (25th), bolstered by significant government investments, including 517 new air routes, 157 airports, and a road network expansion of approximately 145,000 kilometres.



Inbound Tourism

- International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs) in India reached 2.02 crore, reflecting an increase of 54% compared to 1.31 crore in 2014.
- Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) have shown a consistent upward trajectory from 16.8 lakhs in 1991 to 91.5 lakhs in 2025.
- Indian National Arrivals (INAs) in India reached 110.7 lakhs in 2025, reflecting a 4.2% increase over 2024 and a substantial 103% rise compared to the level of 2014.
- In 2025, the top 10 source markets for FTAs in India were the USA, United Kingdom, Australia, Canada, Bangladesh, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Germany, Japan and Nepal accounting for 63.8 % of total FTAs in India.
- Season-wise Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in 2025 showed a clear peak during December, recording 10.8 lakhs arrivals, the highest for the year, with an 11.79% share of total FTAs. This indicates strong winter holiday travel demand, aligning with India's popular travel season due to favorable weather and year-end festivities. Other high-traffic months included January (9.8 lakhs arrivals, 10.73% share), November (9.6 lakhs arrivals, 10.48% share) and February (9.5 lakhs arrivals, 10.39% share), reflecting sustained inbound tourism activity during India's peak travel season from late autumn to early spring.
- Mode-wise data for 2025 shows that air travel remained the dominant means of entry, accounting for 94% of foreign arrivals, followed by land routes (5.4%) and waterways (0.6%). Notably, Delhi and Mumbai airports alone handled 60% of all air arrivals, reaffirming their status as key international gateways to India.
- The gender-wise Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) distribution in 2025 shows 55% males and 45% females. The continued rise in the proportion of female travelers reflects increasing gender diversity in inbound tourism and growing appeal of India as a safe and inclusive destination for women.
- Age-wise Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in 2025 indicate broad appeal across age groups, with the highest shares from the 45-54 (20.7%) followed by 35-44 (19.5%) and 55-64 (15.3%) segments. Significant contributions in FTAs from 25-34 (15%) were mainly related to educational purpose while for 65+ age groups were largely due to Indian diaspora visit.
- The purpose-wise analysis of foreign arrivals in 2025 shows that Leisure, Holiday & Recreation remained the dominant category, accounting for 39.3% of visits, reaffirming India's position as a preferred global travel destination. Visits by the Indian Diaspora formed the second-largest segment at 32.9%, reflecting enduring personal and familial ties. Business and Professional travel comprised 11.7%, indicating India's rising profile as a hub for international business and professional engagement.
- Medical tourism accounted for 5.5% of total foreign arrivals in 2025, with significant contributions from South Asia (28.7%), Africa (20.0%), and the Middle East (15.7%), reinforcing India's position as a destination for affordable, high-quality healthcare. Education-related travel remained modest at 0.73% slightly up from previous year. These patterns highlight India's diverse offerings, attracting visitors for a wide range of purposes.
- The average duration of stay for foreign tourists in India in 2025 stood at 18.48 days. India's rich cultural heritage,

diverse cuisine, and wide range of travel experiences continue to offer strong potential to encourage longer visitor stays.

- Among major source countries, the longest average stays in 2025 were observed among visitors from Canada (30.2 days), the United States (22.6 days) and Australia (22.3 days).

Outbound Tourism

- In 2025, outbound travel from India continued its upward trajectory, recording 3.3 crore departures, a growth of 6.3% over the previous year. This sustained recovery underscores the resilience of India's outbound travel market, supported by rising consumer confidence, expanding aviation networks, and growing demand for international leisure and business travel.
- In 2025, the United Arab Emirates remained the leading destination for Indian nationals, followed by Saudi Arabia, Thailand, USA, Singapore, United Kingdom, Qatar, Kuwait, Oman and Malaysia. Together, these top 10 countries accounted for approximately 70.5% of all Indian Nationals' Departures during the year.
- Air travel continues to be the predominant mode of international travel for Indian residents, with 98.6% of Indian nationals departing by air in 2025. In comparison, 1% traveled via land routes, and 0.4% used waterways.
- In 2025, the leading airports for departures of Indian nationals were Delhi, Mumbai, and Cochin. Delhi Airport recorded the highest share at 22.65%, followed by Mumbai (19.87%) and Bengaluru (8.28%). Collectively, these three airports handled 50.80% of all outbound departures, highlighting their critical role in facilitating international travel from India.

- In 2025, the gender-wise distribution of Indian nationals departing from India indicated that males constituted 65.9% of the total departures, while females accounted for 34.1%, reflecting a continued male dominance in outbound travel trends.
- In 2025, Indian nationals traveling abroad were predominantly from the working-age population, with the 25–34 age group accounting for the highest share (27.6%), followed by the 35–44 age group (24.7%) and 45–54 age group (14.8%). The younger cohort (15–24 years) made up 10.6% of travellers, while children (0–14 years) and senior citizens (65+) represented smaller shares at 8.2% and 5.2%, respectively.
- In 2025, Indian nationals traveling abroad were predominantly from the working-age population, with the 25–34 age group accounting for the highest share (27.6%), followed by the 35–44 age group (24.7%) and 45–54 age group (14.8%). The younger cohort (15–24 years) made up 10.6% of travellers, while children (0–14 years) and senior citizens (65+) represented smaller shares at 8.2% and 5.2%, respectively.

Domestic Tourism

- India recorded 428.7 crore domestic tourist visits in 2025, marking a 45.5% increase over 294.5 crore visits in 2024. Foreign tourist visits (FTVs) stood at 2.53 crore in 2025, showing a 21.4% growth over 2.08 crore in 2024. These visits include visits during the Kumbh Mela held in 2025.
- Uttar Pradesh (155.7 crore) and Tamil Nadu (36 crore) were the top two States in terms of domestic tourist visits whereas Uttar Pradesh (45.08 lakhs) and Maharashtra (44.9 lakhs) recorded the highest number of foreign tourist visits among all States/UTs.



- Among the Centrally Protected Ticketed Monuments, Taj Mahal leads in visitor numbers for both domestic (53.5 lakhs) and foreign (5.4 lakhs) tourists in FY 2025-26.
- Other popular sites for domestic visitors include the Sun Temple Konark (34.2 lakhs) and Qutub Minar (31.5 lakhs).
- Foreign visitors favoured Agra Fort (2.3 lakhs) and Qutub Minar (2.3 lakhs) following the Taj Mahal.

Economic Indicators

- The Tourism Satellite Account (TSA), a United Nations-recommended framework for measuring the economic contribution of tourism-related goods and services, is outlined in this publication. In 2023-24, the travel and tourism sector in India generated approximately 84.63 million jobs (including both direct and indirect employment). During the same period, the sector's total contribution to India's GDP stood at 5.22%, reflecting its significant role in the national economy.
- In 2025, India's Foreign Exchange Earnings (FEEs) from tourism amounted to US\$ 31.7 billion, registering a change of -9.5% over US\$ 35.0 billion in 2024. This accounted for approximately 1.68% of global tourism receipts, reaffirming the sector's significant contribution to the national economy and India's growing presence in the international tourism market.
- In 2025, Indians Spending Abroad (ISA) from Tourism outside India amounted to US\$ 35.5 billion registering a growth of 1.6% over US\$ 34.9 billion in 2024.

Table 1.1.1 presents a comparative time series of International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs) globally and in India from 2001 to 2025, including percentage changes, India's share in global arrivals, and its global rank. Between 2001 and 2025, international tourist arrivals globally grew from 6834 lakhs to 15,340 lakhs. Compared with **2014**, India's International Tourist Arrivals increased from **131.1 lakhs** to **202.2 lakhs** in **2025**, registering an overall growth of **54.2%** during the period. Although ITAs in 2025 declined marginally by **2.33%** compared with **2024** (205.7 lakhs), India continued to maintain a strong global position, ranking **22nd** in the world with a **1.31%** share of global International Tourist Arrivals. The detailed breakdown of International Tourist Arrivals by sub-region, is presented at **Annexure, Table [A1.1]**.

¹Since 2014, in accordance with the definition of International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs), India has included Indian National Arrivals (INAs) in its ITA figures. In earlier publications, the term "NRI" was used instead of "INA".



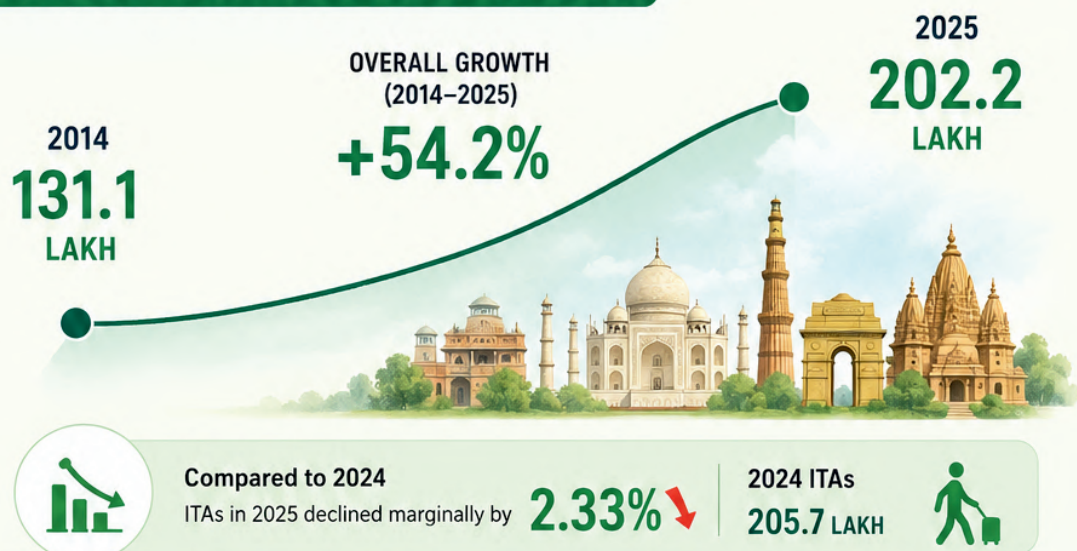

In 2025, France retained its position as the world's top tourist destination, followed by Spain and the United States. Among the top five, Türkiye and Italy ranked 4th and 5th respectively.

India ranked 22nd globally, attracting 202.2 lakh international tourists, marking a 12.9% increase over 2019 and a marginal decline of -1.84% from 2024.

Table 1.2.1 presents the trends in international tourism receipts globally and for India from 2001 to 2025, highlighting the absolute figures, annual growth rates, India's share in global receipts, and its rank among global destinations. Tourism Receipts refers to the financial revenue a country generates from expenditures made by foreign tourists in the reference country.

Globally, International tourism receipts increased from USD 463.8 billion in 2001 to USD 1,884 billion in 2025, reflecting a compound growth trajectory. India's receipts from tourism also

followed a significant upward path, growing from USD 3.2 billion in 2001 to USD 31.7 billion in 2025, establishing its rank from 36th in 2001 to 18th in 2025. The detailed breakdown of International Tourism Receipts by sub-region is presented at **Annexure, Table[A1.2]**.

Table 1.2.2 presents the international tourism receipts for the top 15 countries in 2025, along with their corresponding figures for 2014, 2019 and 2024, percentage share in global receipts, and the growth rates over 2024 and 2014.

The United States continued to lead globally, earning USD 213 billion, which accounted for 11.31% of the world's total tourism receipts in 2025, reflecting a negative growth of 0.37% over 2024 and increase of 81.74% over 2014. Spain ranked second with USD 118.8 billion. The United Kingdom secured the third position, followed by France and Italy, all registering steady gains over the previous years.

Among the fastest-growing destinations in 2025, Saudi Arabia recorded a remarkable 419.51% increase in tourism receipts compared to 2014. Similarly, Japan and Canada also witnessed an increase in tourism receipts by 238.62% and 194.83% respectively.

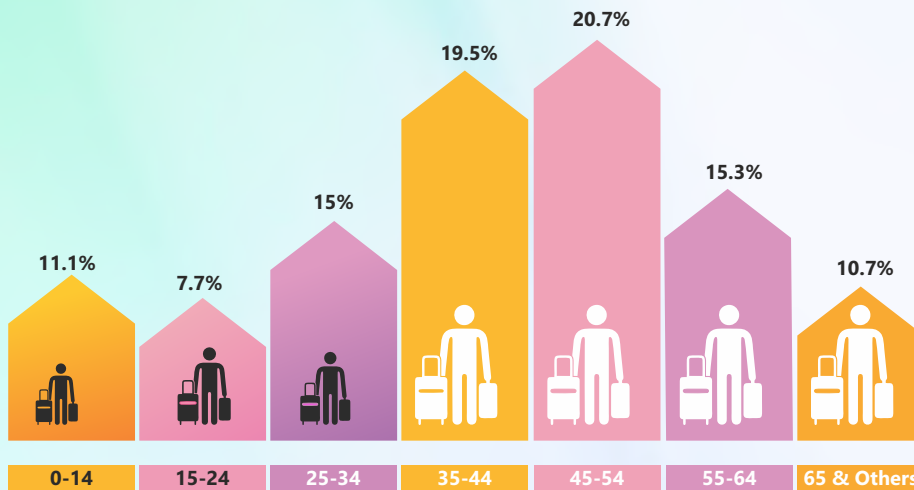

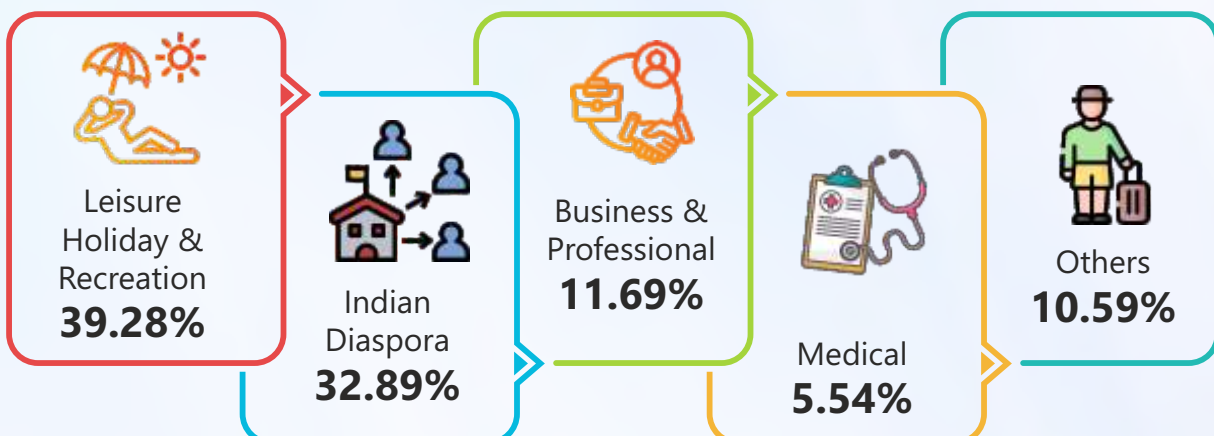

Table 2.1.1 presents year wise data on Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs), Indian National Arrivals (INAs), and total International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs) in India from 1991 to 2025.

FTAs grew steadily over three decades, from 16.8 lakhs in 1991 to 91.5 lakhs in 2025, crossing key milestones along the way: 63.1 lakhs in 2011, and 100 lakhs for the first time in 2017.

As the values of Indian National Arrivals became available from 2014, hence for consistent comparison, the analysis focuses on 2014–2025.

FTAs increased from 76.8 lakhs in 2014 to 91.5 lakhs in 2025, representing an increase of 14.7 lakhs, or 19.14%. FTAs reached 99.5 lakhs in 2024 before declining by 8.0% in 2025. Despite this year-on-year decrease, the 2025 figure remained substantially higher than the 2014 level. The decline in overall FTAs in 2025 was largely driven by a sharp reduction in arrivals from Bangladesh amid political turmoil and social unrest. FTAs from Bangladesh fell by 73.2%, from approximately 18 lakhs to 5 lakhs.

¹Since 2014, in accordance with the definition of International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs), India has included Indian National Arrivals (INAs) in its ITA figures. In earlier publications, the term “NRI” was used instead of “INA”.



INAs recorded significantly stronger growth, increasing from 54.3 lakhs in 2014 to 110.7 lakhs in 2025. This represents an increase of 56.4 lakhs, or 103.87%, meaning that INA volumes more than doubled over the period. INAs grew by a further 4.24% in 2025 compared with 2024.

Total ITAs increased from 131.1 lakhs in 2014 to 202.2 lakhs in 2025 – an increase of 71.1 lakhs, or 54.23%. ITAs reached 205.7 lakhs in 2024 before declining marginally by 1.70% in 2025. The limited decline in total arrivals, despite an 8.0% reduction in FTAs, reflects the continued growth in INAs.

Table 2.1.2 outlines the top 15 source countries contributing to Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in India for 2014, 2019, 2024 and 2025, offering a longer-term view of shifting market composition alongside the pace of recovery from the pandemic.

The ranking has shifted considerably over the eleven-year period, and 2025 brought further movement. The United States of America, which led the table in 2014 with 11.2 lakhs arrivals accounting for 14.6% of total FTAs, held its position as India's top source market in 2025, sending 18.4 lakhs visitors, i.e. 20.1% of total FTAs, up from 18.0 lakhs in 2024 and 15.1 lakhs in 2019. Arrivals from the US have grown 64.6% over 2014 and its share of total FTAs has widened from 14.6% to 20.1%, notwithstanding the brief loss of the top slot to Bangladesh in 2019.

Bangladesh has traced the sharpest arc of any major market. From 9.4 lakhs arrivals in 2014, a 12.3% share and second position, it surged to become the top source market in 2019 with 25.8 lakhs arrivals, slipped to second in 2024 with 17.5 lakhs, and then dropped to fifth in 2025 with just 4.7 lakhs, registering a steep decline of 73.2% over 2024 and standing 50.3% below its 2014 level.

Long-haul markets account for much of the offsetting growth. The United Kingdom, third in 2014 with 8.4 lakhs arrivals, moved up to second position in 2025 with 10.8 lakhs, a gain of 29.3% over 2014, followed by Australia (5.5 lakhs, up 127.5% from ninth place in 2014) and Canada (5.4 lakhs, up 102.7% from sixth place). Malaysia, Sri Lanka and Germany retained their 2024 rankings, while Japan moved up to ninth position, replacing France, which slipped to twelfth. Nepal and Singapore have also gained ground since 2014, rising 73.0% and 44.6% respectively, whereas the Russian Federation has slipped from fifth position in 2014 (2.7 lakhs) to thirteenth (1.7 lakhs) and China, twelfth in 2014 and sixth in 2019, has dropped out of the top fifteen altogether. Italy and Thailand complete the top fifteen source markets in 2025.

A notable structural shift was observed in the composition of India's source markets. The share of the top 15 countries in total FTAs stood at 72.0% in 2014, rose to 76.3% in 2019 and peaked at 77.1% in 2024, before easing to 73.5% in 2025. Correspondingly, the share of FTAs from other countries, which had narrowed from 28.0% in 2014 to 22.9% in 2024, recovered to 26.5% in 2025. Total FTAs grew 19.1% between 2014 and 2025, from 76.8 lakhs to 91.5 lakhs, and the 2025 pattern indicates a gradual re-diversification of India's inbound tourism market beyond its traditional source countries, though the spread remains narrower than it was in 2014.

Table 2.2.1 presents a comparative month-wise analysis of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) to India for 2014, 2024 and 2025, along with growth rates and the monthly share of total arrivals.

In 2025, total FTAs stood at 91.49 lakh, a decline of 8.1% over 2024 but 19.1% above the 2014 level of 76.79 lakh. The monthly distribution kept its familiar seasonal shape. December (11.8%), January (10.7%), November (10.5%) and February (10.4%) remained the four peak months, together accounting for around 43% of annual arrivals, against about 41% for the same four months in 2014, suggesting that even as overall numbers fell against 2024, the winter concentration has, if anything, tightened over the eleven-year period.

Measured against 2014, every month of 2025 recorded higher arrivals, though the gains were distinctly uneven. The strongest increases came in January (up 29.6%), February (up 25.8%), November (up 25.2%), September (up 22.1%) and December (up 21.9%), while May (up 5.2%), August (up 8.6%) and March (up 11.7%) advanced only modestly. The pattern reinforces the same reading: growth over the eleven-year period has been concentrated in the winter peak, with the lean mid-year months contributing comparatively little to the overall expansion.

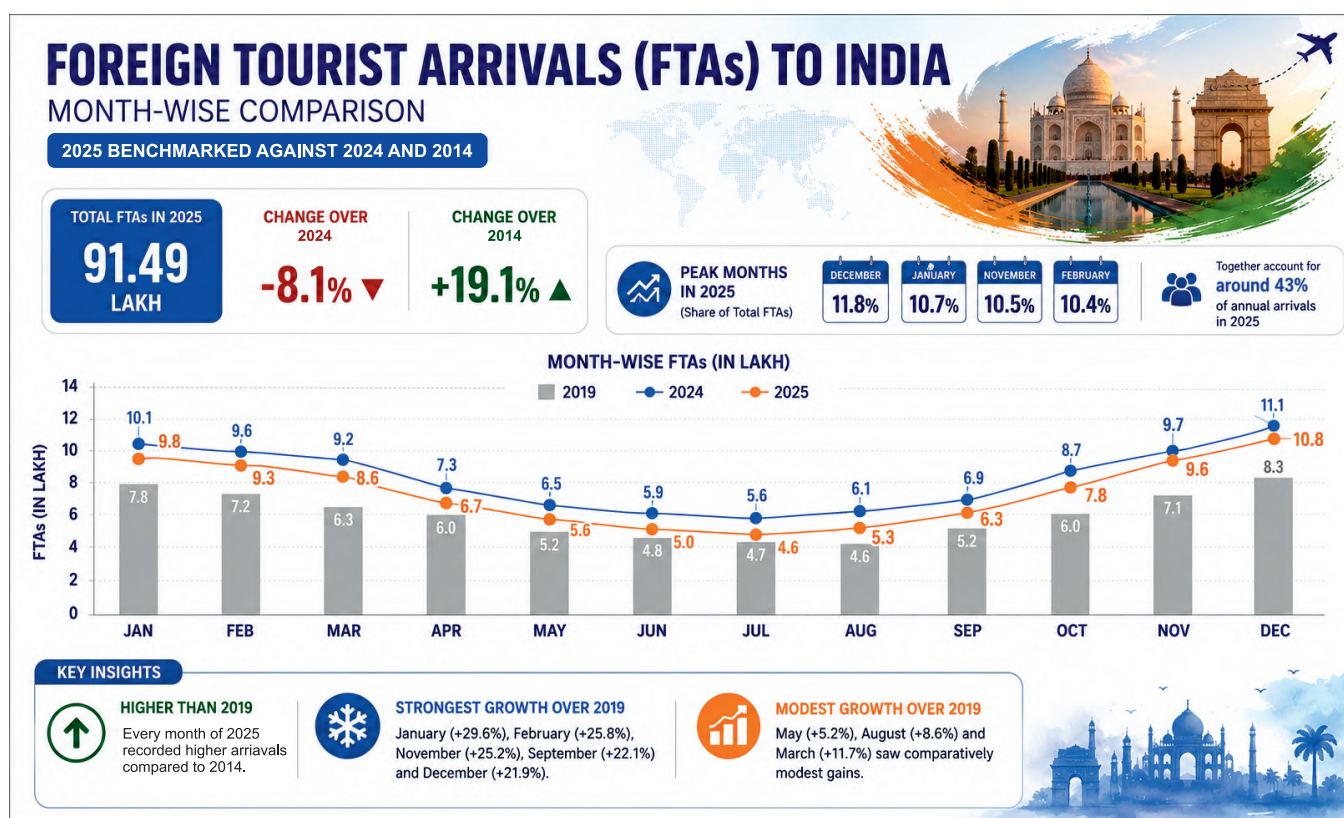

Table 2.2.2 presents the peak and lean months for FTAs from India's top 15 source countries in 2025. December remained the peak month for several major markets, including the United States (13.9%), Australia (21.4%), and Italy (12.8%). The United Kingdom peaked in February (12.1%), as did Canada (13.3%), consistent with patterns seen in prior years. Russia (14.9%) and France (12.7%) showed January as their peak, while Thailand's visitors peaked in February (14.9%).

South Asian source countries continued to follow a different rhythm. Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka show distinct seasonal patterns shaped by medical travel, religious visits, and family ties. Bangladesh recorded equal peaks in October and December (10.6% each), while Nepal peaked in September (11.9%).

May was the lean month for nearly half of the top 15 countries, including the United Kingdom, Australia, Canada, Malaysia, and France. For Russia, the lean month was June (2.4%), which may be attributable to a combination of seasonal factors and geopolitical constraints on outbound travel.

The overall pattern in 2025 confirms that India's inbound tourism retains strong seasonal peaks tied to climate, holidays, and source country academic calendars, with limited progress so far in spreading arrivals more evenly across the year.

Table 2.2.3 presents a comparative month-wise analysis of Indian National Arrivals (INAs) to India for 2014, 2019, 2024 and 2025, along with growth rates over 2024 and 2014 and the monthly share of total arrivals. In 2025, INAs totaled 110.69 lakh, 4.3% above the 2024 level of 106.17 lakh and more than double the 2014 level of 54.28 lakh, an increase of 103.9% over the eleven-year period. For 2025, July (10.52%), December (10.20%) and June (9.46%) were the three peak months, together accounting for just over 30% of the year's arrivals, while February (6.48%), September (6.55%) and April (7.62%) were the leanest.

Measured against 2024, the gain was broad but shallow. Nine of the twelve months recorded higher arrivals, led by August (up 11.6%), May (up 10.8%), March (up 8.1%) and January (up

7.7%), with July adding 6.7% to reach 11.65 lakh. Three months slipped: April (down 2.4%), June (down 1.9%) and October (down 0.3%).

Measured against 2014, the picture is one of near-uniform doubling, though with a clear seasonal tilt. Arrivals more than doubled in seven of the twelve months, the strongest gains coming in May (up 126.6%), June (up 126.3%), November (up 126.2%), October (up 113.5%) and March (up 110.7%). The weakest were January (up 59.4%), February (up 82.9%) and September (up 87.8%) – the only three months to grow by less than the 103.9% recorded for the year as a whole.

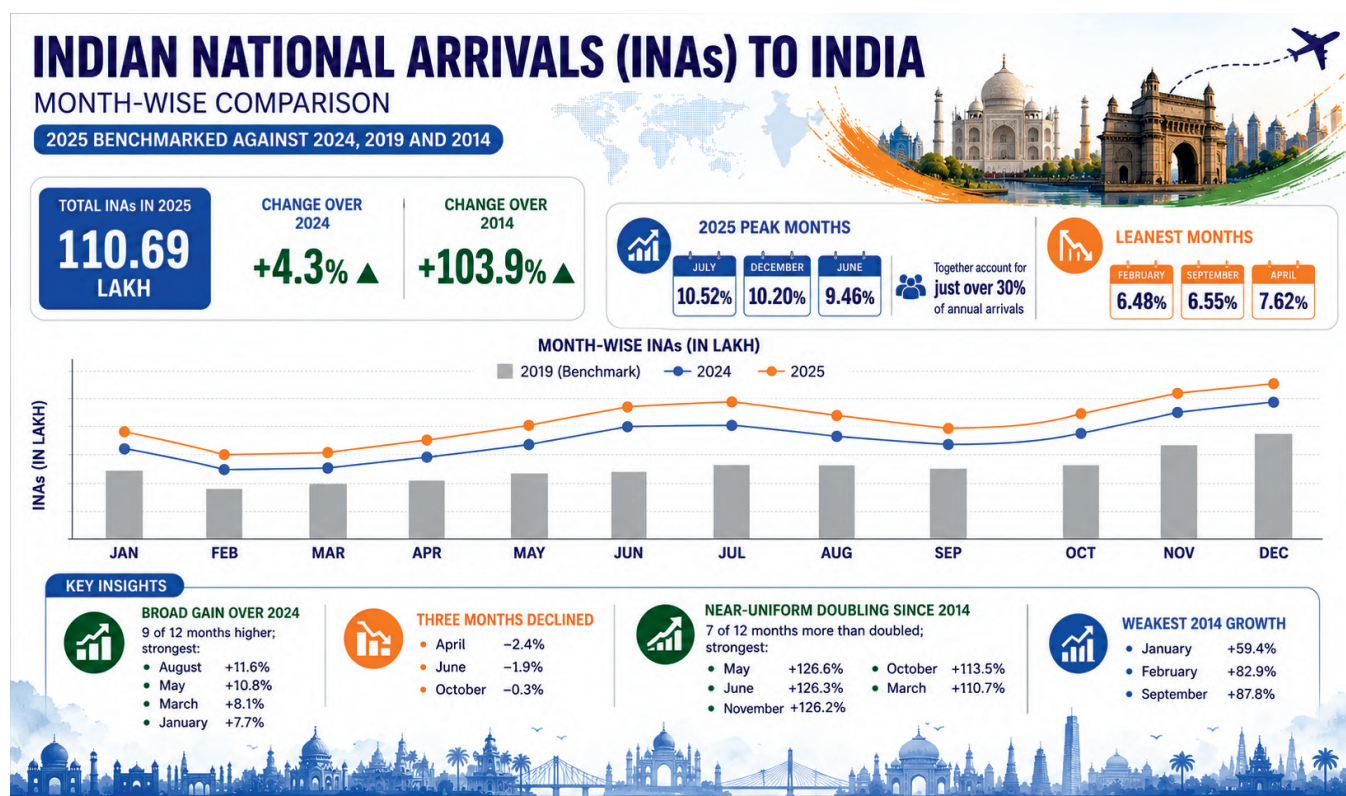

Table 2.2.4 presents the month-wise International Tourist Arrivals (ITAs) to India, highlighting a strong performance in inbound travel. In 2025, total ITAs reached 2.02 crores, reflecting a 54.25% increase over 2014, indicating sustained growth in India's tourism appeal.

The peak arrival months were December (22.07 lakhs; 10.92%), November (19.04 lakhs; 9.42%), and July (18.51 lakhs; 9.16%), together accounting for nearly 30% of total international arrivals. December continued to attract the highest share, while September (6.66%), May (7.10%), and August (7.53%) recorded the lowest shares, possibly influenced by weather-related seasonality.

Overall, the monthly distribution suggests a well-diversified recovery across seasons, reinforcing India's emergence as an all-season destination for international travelers.

Table 2.2.5 presents the distribution of FTAs across the four quarters of each year from 2001 to 2025, bringing out the seasonal profile of India's inbound tourism and how it has shifted over time. Across the long run, except the pandemic year, the pattern has been remarkably stable: the first quarter, January to March, has consistently accounted for around 27 to 31% of annual FTAs, followed by a lean second quarter at 18 to 20%, a moderately active third quarter at 21 to 23%, and a strong fourth quarter contributing close to 30%. The distribution reflects India's enduring appeal during the winter months.

Table 2.3.1 provides a year wise distribution of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) to India by mode of transport, air, land, and water, from 2001 to 2025 highlighting changes in the composition of arrivals by mode of transport over time.



In 2025, 94% of foreign tourists arrived in India by air, 5.4% by land, and 0.6% by water. Air continued to be the dominant mode of entry, registering its highest share since 2011. This is largely due to the sharp fall in arrivals from Bangladesh, the main contributor to land based travel, which pulled the land share down from 16.05% in 2024 to 5.4% in 2025. Land border travel had grown steadily through 2019, peaking at 21.7%, and remains important for visitors from neighboring countries, though its share has dropped considerably this year. Water transport continued to account for a marginal share of FTAs, remaining below 2% throughout the period 2001–2025.

Table 2.4.1 traces the port-wise distribution of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in India from 2001 to 2025, expressing each major port's share of total arrivals in percentage terms alongside the absolute number of FTAs for each year. For 2025, total FTAs stood at 91,48,766, and the distribution across ports was distinctly more concentrated than in the preceding year.

Delhi retained its position as the country's principal gateway with a 34.90% share, up from 32.40% in 2024, followed by Mumbai at 18.00% and Bengaluru at 9.10%. Chennai accounted for 8.90%, Hyderabad 4.80% and Cochin 4.40%, while Kolkata's share eased to 2.20%. Taken together, the top five ports – Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai and Hyderabad – handled 75.7% of all FTAs in 2025, and 'Others' narrowed to 15.4% from 18.36% a year earlier, indicating a re-concentration of inbound traffic at the metropolitan gateways.

The most pronounced shift in 2025 was at Haridaspur, the land check-post on the Bangladesh border, whose share fell sharply to 2.30% in 2025 from 7.92% in 2024 and a peak of 11.70% recorded in 2017. Over the longer horizon the table also records the steady broadening of India's entry points: Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Cochin, which reported negligible or unrecorded arrivals in the early 2000s (denoted '#'), together accounted for 18.30% of FTAs in 2025, underlining the emergence of southern gateways alongside the traditional Delhi-Mumbai axis.

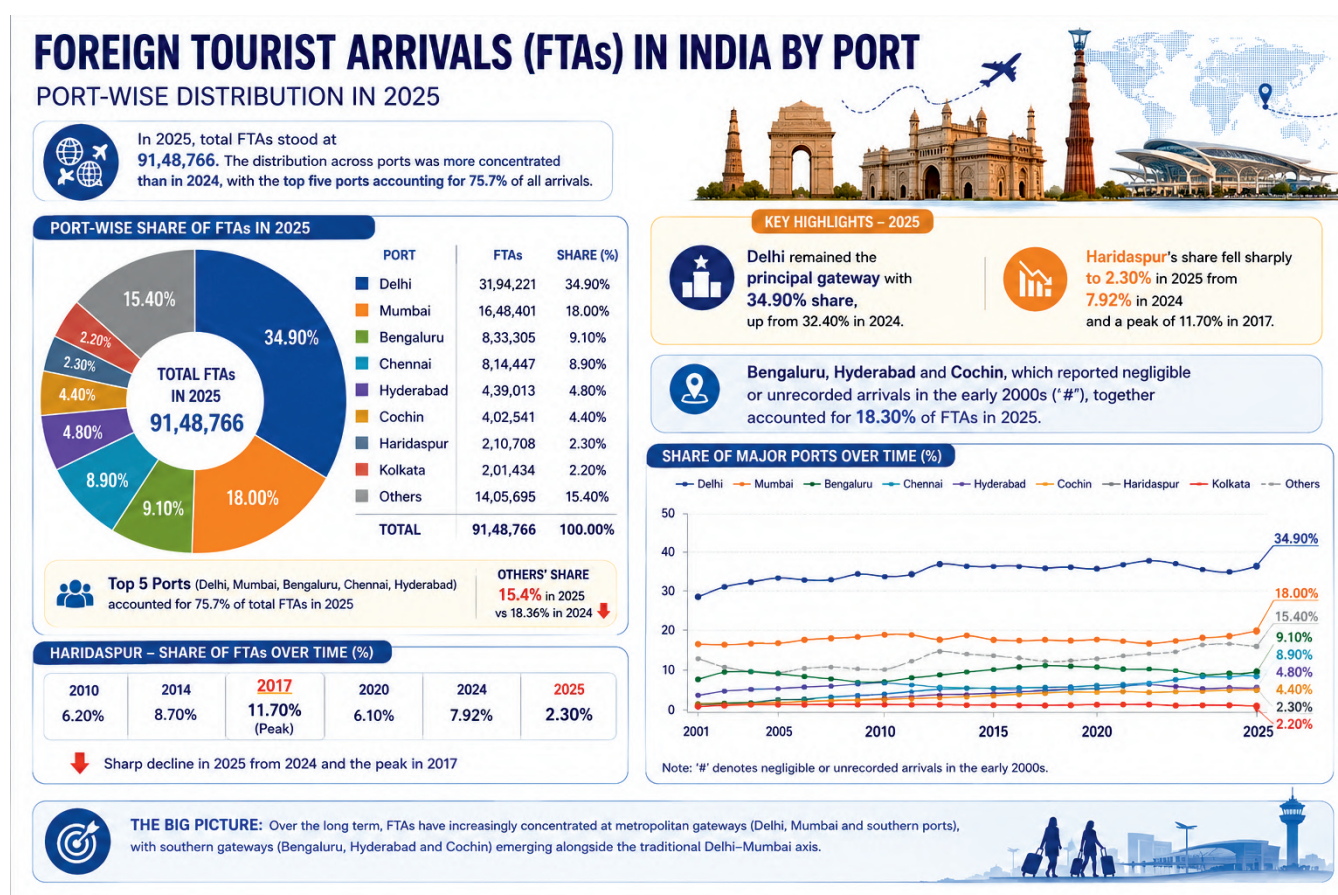

Table 2.5.1 provides a gender-wise distribution, in percentage, of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) to India from 2011 to 2025, presenting trends in the share of female, male, and other gender categories among foreign tourists visiting the country.

The share of female FTAs to India increased steadily from 40.6% in 2011 to 45.0% in 2025, while the share of male FTAs declined correspondingly from 59.4% to 55.0% over the same period. Consequently, the gender gap narrowed from 18.8 percentage points in 2011 to 10.0 percentage points in 2025, the smallest recorded during the period. Although male tourists continued to account for the majority of FTAs in 2025, the data indicate a gradual movement towards a more balanced gender distribution.

Table 2.6.1 provides a distribution of Foreign Tourist Arrivals in India by age group from 2011 to 2025, expressed in percentage terms for each year, covering seven age brackets.

In 2025, the **45-54 years** age group became the single largest segment, accounting for **20.7%** of arrivals. Meanwhile, the **35-44 years** group eased to **19.5%** in 2025 from 20.67% in 2024, down from its long-run historical average of around 21%. Combined, the **35-54 years** demographic continued to dominate overall arrivals, representing **40.2%** of total FTAs in 2025.

The share of FTAs to India in the 25-34 years age group declined, decreasing from 16.6% in 2011 to 15.0% in 2025. In contrast, the shares of older age groups increased over time. In 2025, the 55-64 years age group accounted for 15.3% of FTAs, while the share of tourists aged 65 years and above reached 10.7%, both higher than in 2024.

The 0-14 years age group accounted for 11.1% of FTAs in 2025, marginally higher than in the previous year.

Table 2.7.1 represents the purpose-wise distribution of Foreign Tourist Arrivals to India in 2025, categorised by major world regions and individual countries within those regions. It provides a comprehensive breakdown of the share of tourists arriving for specific purposes such as leisure (holiday), business, medical, education, and others, expressed as percentages of total arrivals from each country.

In the Americas, the largest share of visitors arrived to visit the Indian diaspora, particularly from North America (57.08%). Leisure was the second most common purpose of visit, accounting for 60.77% of arrivals from South America, 45.67% from Central America, and 39.92% from the Caribbean. Business and professional, and medical purposes accounted for relatively small shares across the region.

The Asia and the Pacific region exhibited considerable variation in the purpose of visit. South-East Asia is dominated by leisure tourism at 54.95%, while South Asia shows a markedly different pattern in 2025, with leisure falling to 22.58% and medical travel rising sharply to 28.69% as compared to previous year, driven largely by Bangladesh, where medical travel accounts for 69.38% of arrivals. North-East Asia recorded the highest share of business and professional travel (54.00%), while visitors from Oceania primarily travelled to visit the Indian diaspora (58.23%), followed by leisure (35.21%).

The Middle East, treated as a separate region, was characterised primarily by leisure travel (58.40%), followed by medical travel (15.68%). Medical travel constituted a particularly notable share of arrivals from countries such as Iraq.

Africa continues to show a meaningful share of leisure (30.80%) and medical travel (20.22%).

In Europe, Central and Eastern Europe maintain a dominant share of leisure travel at 64.64%, while Northern Europe continues to reflect strong diaspora connections at 49.73%. Business travel remains more pronounced in Western and Southern Europe, with countries such as Germany, Czech Republic, and Romania showing notably higher business shares than the regional average.

Table 2.8.1 presents the average duration of stay of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in India in 2025, categorized by country and region. It includes the total number of arrivals and the corresponding average number of days tourist from each country stayed in India.

In 2025, the global average duration of stay for foreign tourists in India stood at 18.48 days. Visitors from North America and Oceania recorded longer stays, averaging 24.13 and 22.97 days respectively—led by countries like Canada (30.16 days) and New Zealand (27.17 days). African countries such as Somalia (77.96) and Chad (55.74) displayed exceptionally long stays. By contrast, tourists from South Asia (15.91 days) and South-East Asia (10.72 days) had shorter durations, indicating brief leisure, pilgrimage, or business trips.

The **table 2.9.2** presents the gender-wise distribution of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in India for 2025, disaggregated by the purpose of visit, with each purpose category summing to 100%. Overall, male tourists accounted for 54.98% of arrivals against 45.02% female, indicating a moderately male-skewed but broadly balanced inbound profile.

The gender composition varies markedly by purpose of visit. Business and professional travel was the most male-dominated segment, with men accounting for 76.09% of arrivals against only 23.91% women. Student arrivals (62.71% male) and the residual 'Others' category (65.32% male) were similarly skewed, followed by medical travel (57.85% male) and pilgrimage (56.57% male). Leisure, holiday and recreation was the only purpose in which women formed a majority, at 51.77% against 48.23% men.

Overall, the data suggest that while business and education-related travel continue to be male-dominated, leisure travel exhibits a more balanced gender composition, with women constituting a slight majority.

The table sets out the age distribution of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in India for 2025 by purpose of visit, with each purpose row summing to 100%.

The age profile differs sharply across purposes of visit. Business and professional travel was the most age-concentrated, with 59.36% of arrivals in the 35-54 range and barely 4.3% below the age of 25, consistent with travel by mid-career professionals. Medical travel followed a similar but slightly broader pattern, peaking at 25.77% in the 35-44 band with 64.9% of arrivals aged between 25 and 54. Student arrivals were, as expected, the youngest cohort – 50.08% fell in the 15-24 band and a further 24.13% in 25-34, so roughly three-fourths were below 35.

Pilgrimage travel showed the most distinctive profile, with 35.99% of arrivals in the 0-14 age group and a steadily declining share thereafter, pointing to family- and group-based religious travel involving children. Arrivals of the Indian diaspora were similarly family-oriented, combining a high child share (17.12%) with substantial shares in the 45-54 (23.20%) and 65-and-above (12.23%) bands. Leisure, holiday and recreation was the most evenly distributed purpose, with every band from 25 years upwards contributing between 14% and 18%, and a comparatively high 14.38% share of senior travelers.

Overall, the distribution indicates that India draws its inbound traffic from a mature age profile – close to 47% of all arrivals were aged 45 and above – with the younger segments concentrated almost entirely in education-related and pilgrimage travel. Leisure arrivals are more evenly distributed across adult age groups, while the significant share of senior visitors highlights the diversity of India's inbound tourism profile.

The table gives the average duration of stay of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) in India in 2025, classified by purpose of visit. Across all purposes, foreign tourists stayed an average of 18.48 days, but the spread around this mean is wide, ranging from about a week to over two months depending on the reason for travel.

Student arrivals recorded by far the longest average stay at 65.90 days, followed by pilgrimage at 52.55 days – both reflecting extended, non-discretionary visits tied to academic terms and organised religious itineraries. The residual ‘Others’ category averaged 29.21 days, while the Indian diaspora stayed 25.35 days and medical travellers 23.41 days, the latter consistent with treatment, recovery and follow-up periods. At the shorter end, leisure, holiday and recreation visits averaged 15.53 days and business and professional trips 14.27 days, both below the overall average.

The pattern indicates that the aggregate average of 18.48 days is pulled upward by a small number of long-stay categories, particularly students and pilgrims, while the two largest purpose segments, leisure and business, sit closer to the two-week mark.

Table 2.10.1 provides a year-wise overview of Foreign Exchange Earnings (FEEs) from tourism in India from 1991 to 2025, presented in both ₹ crore and US\$ million terms, along with annual percentage changes.

FEEs in ₹ terms have grown from ₹ 4,318 crore in 1991 to ₹ 2,76,831 crore in 2025, marking a nearly 63-fold increase over three decades.

In US\$ terms, earnings rose from US\$1.861 billion in 1991 to US\$31.689 billion in 2025, indicating a sustained upward trend despite fluctuations.

Major negative shocks occurred in 2020 and 2021, with FEEs falling by over 55% in ₹ terms and nearly 58% in US\$ terms in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A strong rebound is observed in 2022, with 165.59% growth in ₹ terms and 146.91% in US\$ terms. Post-pandemic recovery continues, though the growth rate moderates in 2023 (56.6%) and 2024 (10.1%) in ₹ terms.

Table 2.10.2 presents the quarter-wise Foreign Exchange Earnings (FEEs) from tourism in India for the years 2019, 2024, and 2025 (in ₹ crore). The data highlights the strong recovery and growth of tourism earnings in the post-pandemic period, although some quarterly fluctuations are observed in 2025.

The October-December quarter emerged as the strongest quarter for tourism earnings, reflecting the peak travel season in India. The January-March quarter served as the second-strongest period.

Table 2.10.3 presents the quarter-wise Foreign Exchange Earnings (FEEs) from tourism in India in US dollar terms for the years 2019, 2024, and 2025. The data reflects the continued recovery of India's tourism sector, with earnings in 2025 remaining above the pre-pandemic levels recorded in 2019, despite a moderation compared to 2024.

During the January-March quarter, FEEs stood at US\$ 9,097 million in 2025, compared with US\$ 9,961 million in 2024 and US\$ 7,584 million in 2019. Although earnings declined relative to 2024, they remained significantly higher than the pre-pandemic level.

The April-June quarter recorded FEEs of US\$ 5,855 million in 2025, compared to US\$ 7,352 million in 2024 and US\$ 6,950 million in 2019. This quarter witnessed the sharpest decline in 2025 both in comparison with 2024 and 2019.

In the July-September quarter, FEEs amounted to US\$ 6,813 million in 2025, lower than US\$ 7,635 million in 2024 and US\$ 7,642 million in 2019. The decline indicates relatively subdued tourism earnings during the monsoon season.

The October-December quarter continued to be the strongest contributor to annual tourism earnings, reflecting increased tourist activity during the peak travel season. FEEs reached US\$ 9,924 million in 2025, marginally lower than US\$ 10,068 million in 2024 but substantially higher than US\$ 8,545 million recorded in 2019.

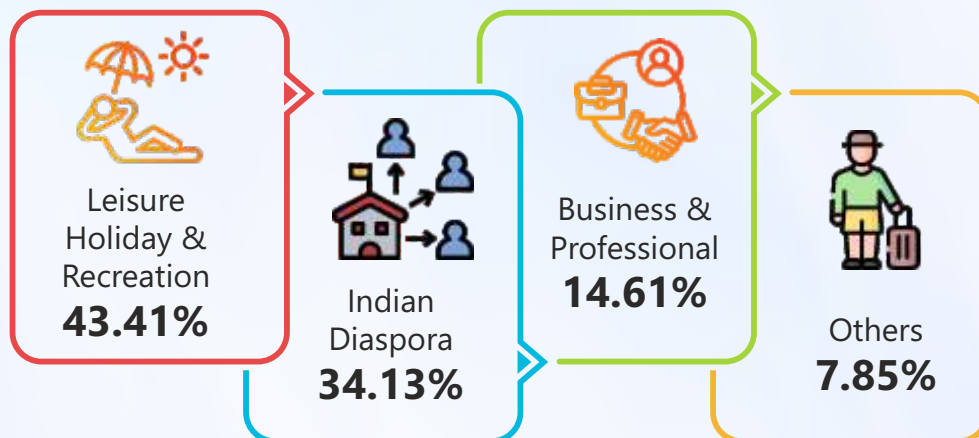

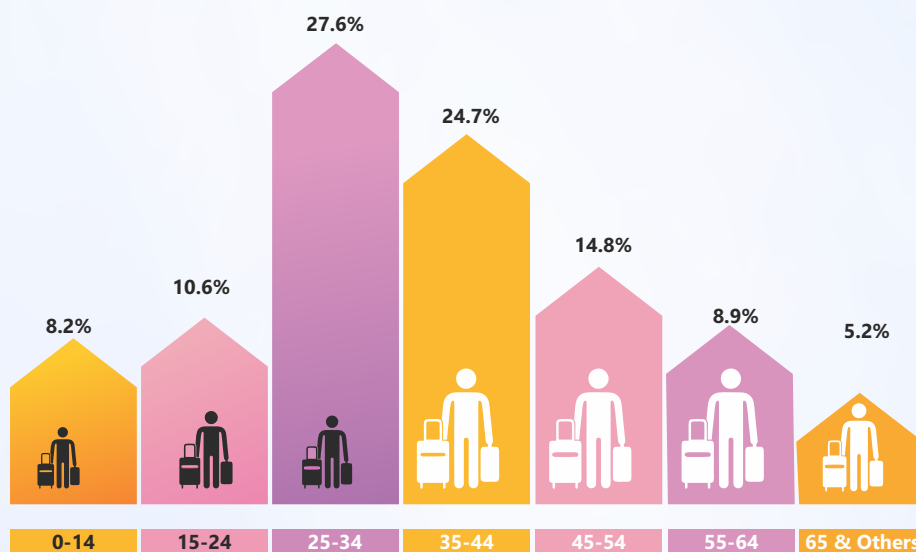

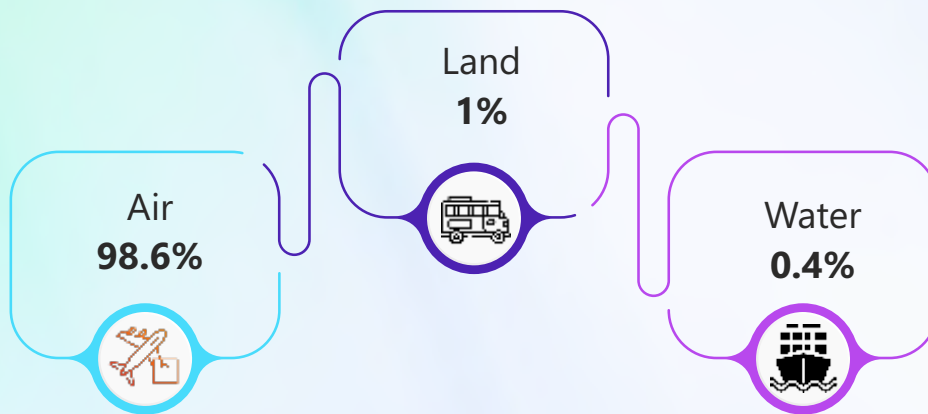

3.1 Outbound Tourism from India

Table 3.1.1 provides a year-wise account of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India along with the percentage change over the previous year, covering selected years from 1991 to 2025. The data reflects the long-term trajectory of outbound travel by Indian nationals and highlights significant fluctuations influenced by domestic and global factors.

Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India have shown a strong upward trend over the past three and a half decades, rising from 19.4 lakh in 1991 to 328.3 lakh in 2025, reflecting a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 8.67%. The 2014–2025 comparison brings out the pace of this expansion in the more recent period: departures rose from 183.3 lakh in 2014 to 328.3 lakh in 2025, an increase of about 79% over eleven years, equivalent to a CAGR of roughly 5.4%. Apart from the disruption during the COVID-19 pandemic period, the series shows sustained expansion, with a 152.62% rise in 2022, 29.05% in 2023 and 10.79% in 2024. Departures in 2025 grew by a further 6.29% over 2024 to reach an all-time high, well above the 2019 level of 269.2 lakh, indicating the continued expansion of India's outbound tourism market.

The details pertaining to region and subregion wise INDs are provided in **Annexure - Table [A3.1]**.

Table 3.1.2 presents the top 15 destination countries visited by Indian Nationals (INDs) during outbound travel for the years 2019, 2024, and 2025, along with their percentage share of total departures in each year.

In all three years — 2019, 2024, and 2025 — the United Arab Emirates (UAE) consistently ranked first, receiving the highest number of Indian travelers. Departures to the UAE rose further to 86.5 lakhs in 2025, up from 77.9 lakhs in 2024 and 63.9 lakhs in 2019, and its share of total outbound travel increased to 26.34% in 2025.

Saudi Arabia maintained its second position, though departures eased slightly to 33.8 lakhs in 2025 from 34.2 lakhs in 2024, still well above the 29.2 lakhs recorded in 2019. Its share of total departures moderated to 10.28% in 2025.

Thailand overtook the United States to claim third position in 2024, and retained it in 2025, with departures rising to 22.3 lakhs from 21.4 lakhs in 2024. The United States slipped to fourth place, with departures of 20.1 lakhs in 2025, its share of total outbound travel easing further to 6.13%.

Singapore held fifth position with 15.5 lakhs departures in 2025, followed by the United Kingdom (14.0 lakhs) and Qatar (11.5 lakhs). Canada and Australia continued to feature in the top 15, while Vietnam entered the top 15 in 2024 and maintained 13th place in 2025 with 6.2 lakhs departures, reflecting its sustained multi-year growth momentum, displacing Bangladesh from the top 15.

Indonesia and Sri Lanka rounded out the top 15 in 2025 at 14th and 15th positions respectively, both recording modest year-on-year movement in departures compared with 2024.

Collectively, the top 15 countries accounted for 262.8 lakhs departures, representing 80.05% of total Indian outbound travel in 2025. This compares with 80.59% in 2024 and 80.76% in 2019, indicating that while the top destinations remain dominant, the concentration has eased marginally as departures to a broader set of countries — including several high-growth destinations outside the top 15 — continue to rise (details pertaining to Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India to Selected Countries and Territories are provided in **Annexure – Table [A3.2]**).

3.2 Seasonal Trends in Outbound Tourism from India

Table 3.2.1 presents the month-wise departures of Indian Nationals (INDs) from India for the years 2019, 2024, and 2025, along with percentage share and growth rates over previous years.

Among all months, May (9.23%) had the highest share of departures in 2025, followed by September (8.89%), April (8.78%), August (8.77%), and December (8.71%), indicating strong mid-year and festive-season travel patterns.

Growth in 2025 was positive across all months compared to 2019 and 2024. April and October stood out with strong double-digit growth over both 2019 (25.73% and 26.68% respectively) and 2024 (12.11% and 11.93% respectively), while May, despite recording the highest share, saw comparatively moderate growth of 2.88% over 2024, following an already strong 2024 base. The steady month-on-month distribution continues to reflect year-round travel demand rather than concentration in a single peak period.

Table 3.2.2 highlights the peak and lean months for Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) in 2025 to the top 15 destination countries. The data indicates clear month-wise variations in departure volumes across markets.

Among Southeast Asian countries, December emerges as a strong peak month for Thailand, Vietnam and Sri Lanka, while May remains the peak period for Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia. Australia shows February as its peak month and September as its lean month, while Canada peaks in March. Among Middle Eastern destinations, the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Qatar and Kuwait consistently see August as the peak travel month, with lean periods spread across February, March, June and July depending on the country.

Table 3.2.3 presents the quarterly distribution (%) of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India for the years 2019 to 2025, capturing outbound travel patterns and their fluctuations over time.

Except during the disruption due to the Pandemic, between 2019 and 2025, departures were broadly balanced across the year, with a slight preference for mid-year travel.

The year 2020 marked a sharp deviation due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over 71% of the year's departures occurred in Q1 before international travel restrictions came into force. Subsequent quarters recorded drastically lower shares, with Q2 dipping to 1.4%.

A partial recovery began in 2021, driven by a strong fourth quarter (43.4%). In 2022, travel demand strengthened, with Q3 (28.6%) and Q4 (28.1%) together accounting for more than half of the year's departures.



The years 2023, 2024 and 2025 reflect a sustained return to pre-pandemic seasonal stability. In 2025, Q2 (25.81%) and Q3 (25.39%) remained the most travelled periods, followed by Q4 (25.05%) and Q1 (23.76%) – a pattern very close to that observed in 2024. The consistently narrow spread between quarters, now maintained for a third successive year, highlights that outbound travel from India has settled into a stable, broadly balanced seasonal pattern across the year. Detailed quarter wise INDs region wise and sub region wise are available at **Annexure -Table [A3.3]**.

3.3 Mode of Transport of Indian Nationals' Departures from India

Table 3.3.1 presents the mode-wise distribution of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) during 2019-2025. The data shows that air transport remained the dominant mode of international travel, accounting for over 97 per cent of total departures throughout the period. The share of air travel increased from 98.2 per cent in 2019 to 98.6 per cent in 2025, reflecting the continued preference for air connectivity among outbound Indian travellers.

The share of departures through land routes remained relatively low, ranging between 0.8 per cent and 1.9 per cent, while sea transport accounted for less than 1 per cent of total departures in all years. The share of sea travel declined from 0.8 per cent in 2020 and 2021 to 0.4 per cent in 2025. The details of travel country-wise with regard to mode of transport are mentioned in **Annexure – Table [A3.4]**.

3.4 Port of Exit of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India

Table 3.4.1 presents the port-wise distribution of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India across major airports for the years 2019 to 2025. The data shows that international departures continue to be highly concentrated through a handful of major gateways.

In 2025, Delhi Airport recorded the highest volume of departures at 74.4 lakhs, accounting for 22.65% of total INDs. It was followed by Mumbai Airport with 65.2 lakhs (19.87%) and, notably, Bengaluru Airport with 27.2 lakhs (8.28%), which overtook Cochin, Chennai and Hyderabad to become the third-busiest gateway for outbound travel. Together, the top three airports facilitated over 163.8 lakhs departures, contributing 49.89% of total outbound departures.

In 2025, the top 10 international airports together accounted for 284.4 lakhs departures of Indian Nationals, comprising 86.63% of the total INDs. The remaining 13.37% – around 43.9 lakhs departures – were facilitated through other international ports located in cities with expanding air connectivity and emerging travel demand.

Post-pandemic recovery is evident across all major ports, with departures from every major gateway now well above their 2019 volumes. Bengaluru's rise to 27.2 lakhs departures in 2025 is the most striking shift, overtaking Cochin (24.2 lakhs), Chennai (23.3 lakhs) and Hyderabad (23.2 lakhs), which had all previously ranked ahead of it – pointing to a rapidly strengthening pattern of international mobility from South India's technology hub.

Overall, while Delhi and Mumbai remain dominant, Bengaluru's emergence as the third-largest gateway, alongside the continued growth of Cochin, Chennai and Hyderabad, reflects expanding regional connectivity and outbound demand from southern India.

Table 3.5.1 presents the gender-wise distribution of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India during 2019-2025. It indicates that male travellers accounted for the majority of outbound departures throughout the period, although the share of female travellers has shown a gradual increase.

The proportion of female travellers increased from 31.4 per cent in 2019 to 34.2 per cent in 2024, before marginally declining to 34.1 per cent in 2025. Correspondingly, the share of male travellers decreased from 68.6 per cent in 2019 to 65.9 per cent in 2025, reflecting a gradual narrowing of the gender gap in outbound travel. The share of other genders remained negligible throughout the period. **Table [A3.5]** in Annexure highlights the departure patterns of Indian Nationals to various regions through major Indian airports in 2025. The country-wise details are mentioned in **Annexure - Table [A3.6]**.

3.6 Age Group-wise Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India

Table 3.6.1 presents the Age group-wise distribution of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India, table reflects that the 25-34 years age group consistently accounted for the largest share of outbound travel, followed by the 35-44 years age group. Together, these two age groups contributed more than half of all Indian departures throughout the period, highlighting the predominance of working-age individuals in international travel.

Travelers aged 45-54 years constituted the third-largest segment, with their share rising marginally from 14.5 per cent in 2019 to 14.8 per cent in 2025. The proportion of those in the 55-64 years age group also increased slightly, from 8.8 per cent to 8.9 per cent over the same period.

The younger age groups, namely 0-14 years and 15-24 years, together accounted for around one-fifth of total departures. Their shares remained relatively stable during the period, with children aged 0-14 years constituting around 8 per cent and the 15-24 years age group accounting for around 11 per cent of outbound travellers. The share of senior citizens aged above 65 years increased from 4.6 per cent in 2019 to 5.2 per cent in 2025, indicating a gradual rise in international travel among older age groups. The country-wise details are mentioned in **Annexure - Table [A3.7]**.

3.7 Purpose-wise Departures of Indian Nationals from India

Table 3.7.1 presents the purpose-wise distribution of Indian Nationals' Departures from India to selected countries and territories in 2025, classified by major world regions and sub-regions. It reflects the percentage share of different travel purposes – such as leisure, business, education, pilgrimage, diaspora, and others – highlighting regional trends and country-specific patterns in outbound travel behaviour.



In 2025, the Middle East remained the top destination region, accounting for a large share of Indian departures driven primarily by diaspora (52.14%) and Leisure (25.3%) related travel. Countries such as Saudi Arabia (39.68% diaspora and 34.81% pilgrimage) and the UAE (52.45% diaspora) continued to dominate this trend, reflecting strong community and religious linkages. Business travel (14.31%) and Pilgrimage (7.59%) remained secondary in this region.

The Asia and the Pacific region recorded substantial tourism outflows, particularly for leisure, holiday, and recreation (73.75%), making it the leading purpose in this region. Within sub-regions, South-East Asia topped the leisure segment (78.04%), especially Thailand (92.95%) and Vietnam (93.78%). South Asia followed with 74.10% leisure travel, with Bhutan (89.85%) and Sri Lanka (85.09%) standing out. South Asia also showed modest shares of pilgrimage (0.66%) and diaspora travel (2.41%). North-East Asia reported 62.36% leisure travel and 11.66% diaspora, led by destinations like Hong Kong and Japan. Oceania, while showing 54.69% leisure, stood out for having a significant diaspora share (20.52%) and one of the highest education-related travel proportions (8.97%), especially to Australia (9.99%).

Europe demonstrated a diverse travel purpose profile with leisure (46.72%), diaspora (29.33%), and business (14.43%) as key motives. The Central and Eastern Europe sub-region showed a strong leaning toward leisure (58.41%) and education (15.60%), with Azerbaijan (94.23% leisure) and Kazakhstan (79.35% leisure, 11.56% education) being major contributors. Northern Europe, especially Ireland (60.98%) and the UK (34.01%), had high diaspora shares. Southern/Mediterranean Europe showed balanced shares across leisure (43.38%), diaspora (30.61%), and business (20.99%), with notable business travel to Israel (56.89%) and Montenegro (62.77%). Western Europe featured a similar mix, with Switzerland (77.00%) and France (68.92%) leading in leisure travel, and Germany (39.06%) and Belgium (36.76%) having high diaspora shares.

In the Americas, travel purposes were more evenly distributed, though leisure (46.07%) and diaspora (27.85%) dominated. North America, especially the United States and Canada, reflected a substantial share of Indian diaspora travellers (25.61% and 34.82%, respectively). The region also saw a significant education component (6.01% in North America). In South America, business travel (44.95%) took the lead, especially in Brazil (51.42%) and Guyana (64.39%). The Caribbean showed a mixed pattern, with Haiti (75.14% leisure) and Barbados (76.18% business) showing sharp contrasts. Central America also reported high business travel (55.06%), particularly to Panama (72.41%).

In Africa, the dominant purpose was leisure travel (55.47%), followed by diaspora (20.77%) and business (20.16%). The Sub-Saharan Africa sub-region largely mirrored these trends, though countries like Nigeria (47.64%) and Botswana (47.60%) had higher diaspora shares. Mauritius stood out with an exceptional 78.38% leisure travel. North Africa showed more varied patterns: Algeria had a dominant business share (44.18%), whereas Morocco (60.40%) and Tunisia (57.12%) saw the majority of travellers visiting for leisure. Sudan was an exception with a notable 17.84% pilgrimage travel.

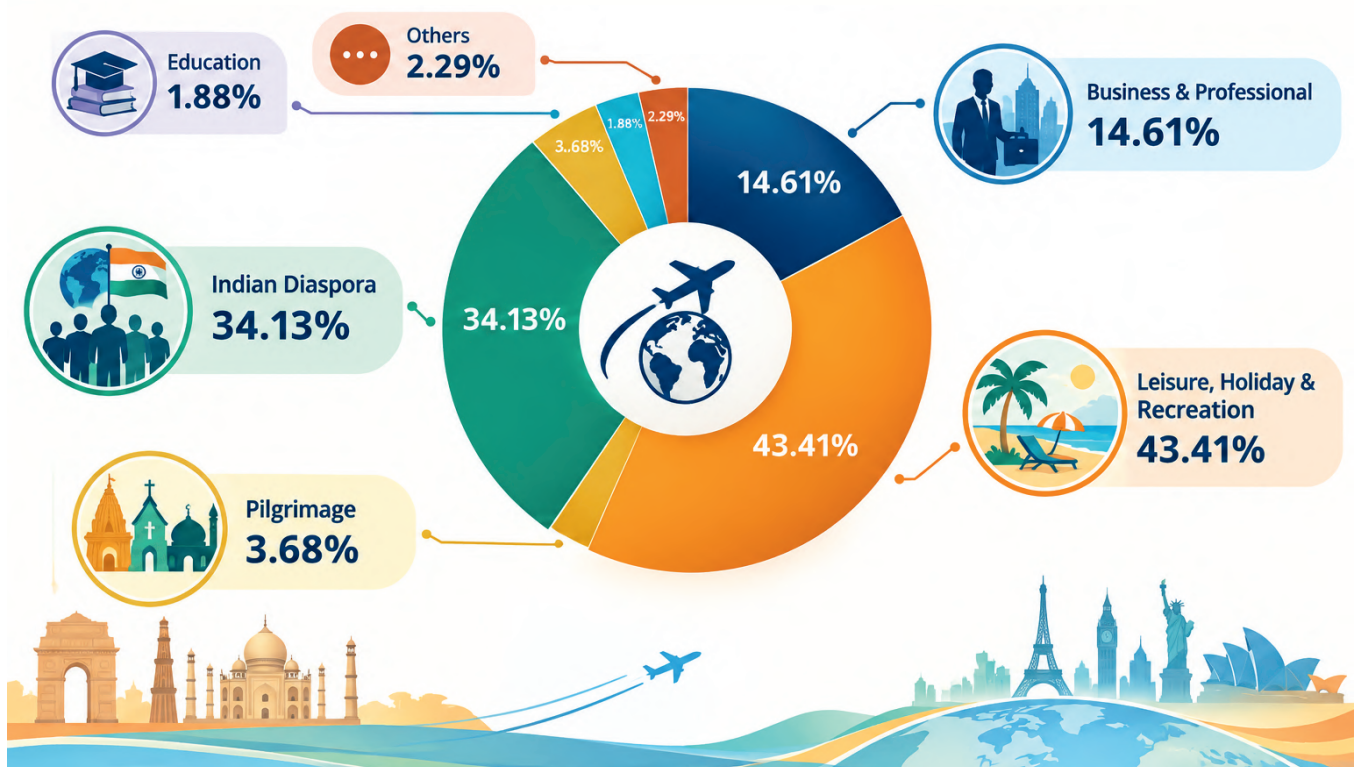

3.8 Average Duration of Stay of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India

Table 3.8.1 presents the average duration of stay of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India to selected countries and territories in 2025, categorized by country and region. It includes the total number of departures and the corresponding average number of days Indian travellers spent in each destination.

In 2025, the Middle East region recorded an average stay duration of 60.97 days, reflecting long-term visits driven by diaspora and work-related purposes. Countries such as Libya (100.76 days), Lebanon (97.34 days), and Kuwait (92.12 days) had significantly high average stays, suggesting extended familial or professional engagements. The United Arab Emirates (58.86 days) and Saudi Arabia (52.99 days), which accounted for a large number of departures, also showed moderately long durations.

The Asia and the Pacific region saw an overall average stay of 22.48 days, with notable variation across sub-regions. Oceania stood out with a high average duration of 85.22 days, led by countries like New Zealand (86.48 days) and Australia (85.54 days), likely linked to diaspora and education-related stays. In contrast, South Asia reported the lowest average stay of 14.06 days, with countries like Sri Lanka (8.58 days), Bhutan (10.00 days), and Nepal (12.30 days) reflecting short-haul leisure or pilgrimage trips. South-East Asia had an average of 19.07 days, while North-East Asia posted 25.12 days, with longer stays in South Korea (39.55 days) and Japan (27.81 days).

The Europe region reported an average stay of 54.23 days, varying widely by sub-region. Northern Europe had a longer stay average at 72.42 days, with Ireland (109.89 days) and the United Kingdom (72.92 days) being major contributors, likely due to education and family links. Central/Eastern Europe reported 30.56 days. Southern/Mediterranean Europe stood at 51.41 days and Western Europe had an average of 45.92 days.

In the Americas, the average stay was relatively long at 85.46 days, reflecting a combination of diaspora, education, and business-related visits. North America posted 86.23 days, with Canada (108.82 days) showing notably extended stays compared with the United States (80.22 days), indicative of study and long-term familial travel. Central America had one of the highest averages at 101.62 days, led by Panama (147.79 days). South America reported 64.01 days, with countries like Uruguay (100.85 days) and Brazil (69.79 days) showing extended durations. The Caribbean posted an average stay of 56.81 days.

In Africa, the average stay was 56.50 days, with a notable distinction between North Africa (49.86 days) and Sub-Saharan Africa (56.79 days).

Taking all the Indian National' Departures to different countries of the world, the overall average duration of stay was 47.29 days.

The table 3.9.1 presents the gender composition of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India in 2025 by purpose of travel, with each purpose row summing to 100%. Overall, men accounted for 65.88% of departures against 34.12% women.

The gender balance differs considerably across purposes. Business and professional travel was the most male-dominated, with men forming 79.29% of departures against 20.71% women, followed by departures of diaspora-related travel (68.95% male). Education-related travel was the most balanced of the male-majority segments at 59.04% male and 40.96% female, while leisure, holiday and recreation recorded 60.46% male against 39.53% female.

Pilgrimage was the only purpose in which women formed a majority, at 51.83% against 48.16% men, indicating the relatively higher participation of women in organised religious travel abroad.

The **table 3.9.2** sets out the age distribution of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) from India in 2025 by purpose of travel, with each purpose row summing to 100%. Outbound travel was concentrated in the younger working ages: the 25–34 group formed the largest share at 27.64%, followed by 35–44 at 24.66% and 45–54 at 14.85%. The 25–44 range alone accounted for 52.30% of all departures, while the 15–24 group contributed 10.62%, children aged 0–14 8.18%, the 55–64 band 8.90% and travellers aged 65 and above only 5.16%.

The age profile varies sharply by purpose. Education-related departures were the youngest and most concentrated of all categories, with 68.41% in the 15–24 band and a further 28.75% in 25–34, so over 97% of student travellers were aged between 15 and 34. Business and professional travel peaked slightly later, at 40.50% in the 25–34 band and 28.96% in 35–44, giving 69.46% in the 25–44 range with a negligible 3.40% aged 55 and above. Diaspora-related travel was somewhat older and more family-oriented, peaking at 29.01% in the 35–44 band while also carrying an 11.91% share of children aged 0–14.

Pilgrimage stood out as the oldest travel purpose, rising steadily with age to peak at 19.58% in the 55–64 band, with 17.86% in 45–54 and 13.46% aged 65 and above — over half of all pilgrimage departures were made by travellers aged 45 and older. Leisure, holiday and recreation was the most evenly spread purpose, with meaningful shares in every band from children (8.33%) through to senior travellers (8.31%), consistent with family holiday travel.

Overall, the distribution shows that India's outbound travel is driven predominantly by the 25–44 age group, powered by work- and education-related mobility, with faith-based travel forming the principal exception at the older end of the spectrum.

The table 3.9.3 gives the average length of stay abroad of Indian Nationals' Departures (INDs) in 2025, classified by purpose of travel. Across all purposes, Indian nationals spent an average of 47.29 days outside the country, but the dispersion around this figure is very wide, ranging from about a fortnight to more than four months depending on the reason for travel.

Education-related departures recorded by far the longest average stay at 133.91 days, close to four and a half months, reflecting academic terms and course durations rather than discretionary travel. Diaspora-related travel followed at 104.12 days, consistent with extended family visits and residence-linked movement, while business and professional trips averaged 53.95 days. At the shorter end, leisure, holiday and recreation averaged 24.06 days and pilgrimage 23.76 days.

The pattern shows that the overall average duration of 47.29 days is pulled sharply upward by education and diaspora travel while the two most volume-driven leisure-type segments sit at roughly three weeks.

Table 3.10.1 presents the year-wise Indians Spending Abroad (ISA) by Indian nationals travelling abroad during 2019-2025 in both ₹ crore and US\$ million terms, along with annual percentage changes.

Indians Spending Abroad in ₹ terms declined sharply from ₹ 1,61,310 crore in 2019 to ₹ 92,925 crore in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and international travel restrictions. Thereafter, expenditure recovered steadily, reaching ₹ 3,09,715 crore in 2025, which was nearly double the pre-pandemic level.

In US\$ terms, expenditure fell from US\$ 22915 million in 2019 to US\$ 12574 million in 2020, before increasing consistently to US\$ 35528 million in 2025.

The strongest recovery was recorded in 2022, when Indians Spending Abroad increased by 93.2 per cent in ₹ terms and 81.2 per cent in US\$ terms over the previous year. Growth continued during 2023-2025, although at a more moderate pace.

Table 3.10.2 presents the quarter-wise Indians Spending Abroad (ISA) by Indian nationals travelling abroad for the years 2019, 2024 and 2025 in ₹ crore terms.

Indians Spending Abroad increased from ₹ 1,61,310 crore in 2019 to ₹ 2,92,620 crore in 2024 and further to ₹ 3,09,715 crore in 2025, highlights the increasing spending by Indian nationals on overseas travel and the continued growth of outbound tourism in recent years.

Table 3.10.3 presents the quarter-wise Foreign Exchange Expenditure (FEEEx) by Indian nationals travelling abroad for the years 2019, 2024 and 2025 in US\$ million terms.

Foreign exchange expenditure increased from US\$ 22915 million in 2019 to US\$ 34972 million in 2024 and further to US\$ 35528 million in 2025, reflecting the strong recovery and continued growth of outbound travel by Indian nationals.



In 2025, the July-September quarter recorded the highest expenditure at US\$ 9457 million, followed by the April-June quarter at US\$ 9085 million and the October-December quarter at US\$ 9052 million. The January-March quarter accounted for US\$ 7934 million. While expenditure till the April-June quarter were marginally lower than in 2024, the succeeding quarters recorded higher spending than the corresponding quarters of the previous year.

Compared with 2019, foreign exchange expenditure in all quarters of 2025 was substantially higher, underscoring the robust expansion of outbound tourism.

The Ministry of Tourism compiles the number of Domestic and Foreign Tourist Visits to different States and Union Territories (UTs) based on the information received from them. The compilation of domestic tourism statistics is undertaken by the Departments of Tourism of State Governments /UT Administrations. These statistics are generally based on the monthly returns collected from hotels and other accommodation establishments.

All India trends and data obtained from other administrative sources like Bureau of Immigration have also been appropriately used to estimate domestic and foreign tourist visits to the States/UTs, wherever required.

4.1. Domestic and Foreign Tourist Visits

Table 4.1.1 indicates the trends in domestic and foreign tourist visits to States/UTs during the period 1991 to 2025, along with the annual growth rates.

Domestic Tourist Visits have shown a sustained upward trend, recording a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 12.11% across all States/UTs during the period 2011-2025. Over the period 2014-2025, Domestic Tourist Visits (DTV) increased substantially from 128.28 crore to 428.55 crore, registering an overall increase of about 234%. The growth was particularly pronounced in the post-pandemic period, with DTVs increasing from 67.76 crore in 2021 to 428.55 crore in 2025. In 2025, DTVs recorded a growth of 45.51% over the previous year. Foreign Tourist Visits (FTVs) increased from 2.23 crore in 2014 to 2.53 crore in 2025, representing an overall increase of about 13%. Following the sharp decline during the pandemic, FTVs recovered strongly, increasing from 0.11 crore in 2021 to 2.53 crore in 2025, with a growth of 21.63% in 2025 over 2024.

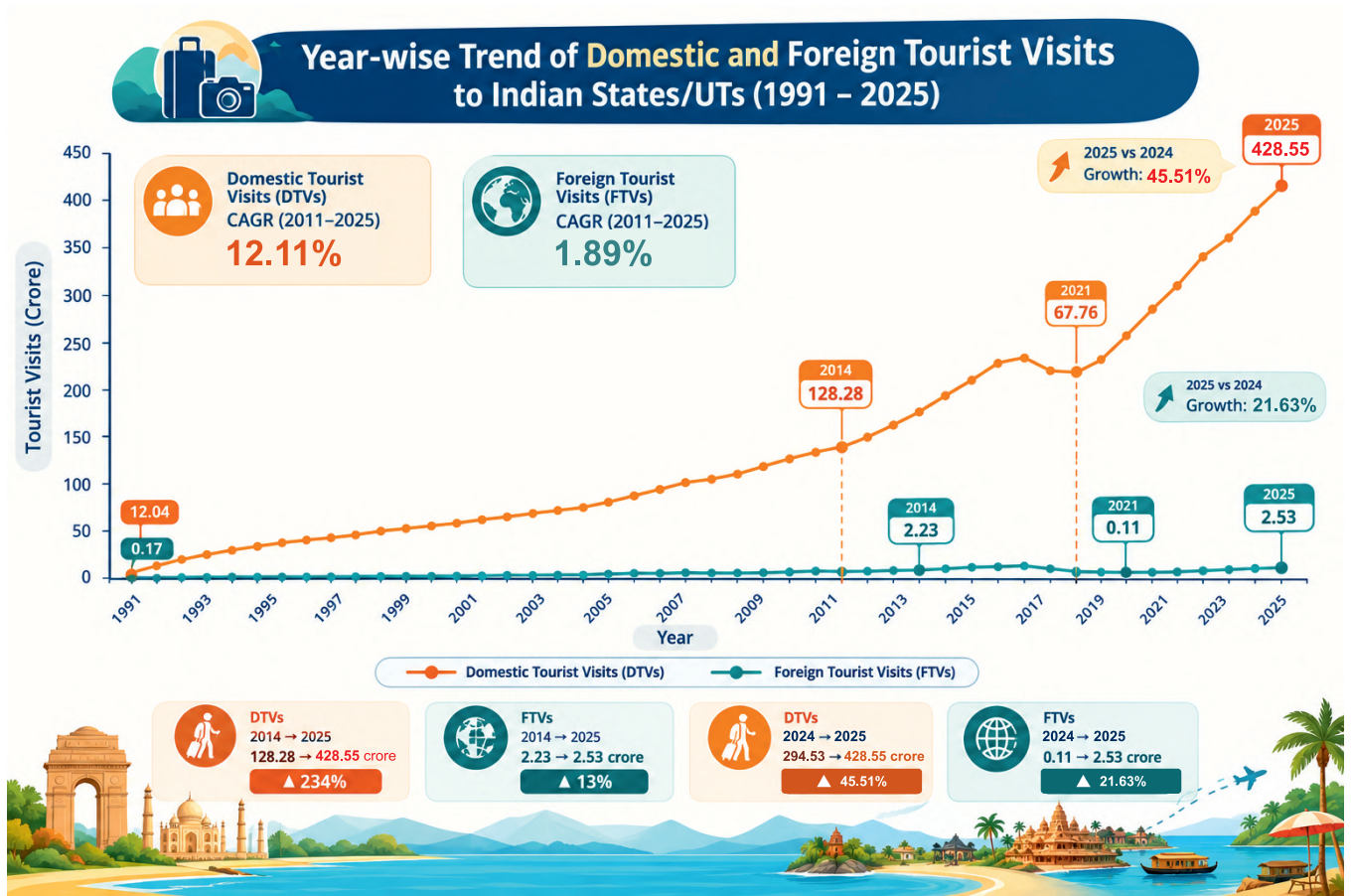

Table 4.1.2 indicates the States/UT-wise distribution of domestic and foreign tourist visits during 2024 and 2025, highlighting the growth rates over the previous year as well as the percentage share of each State/UT in total domestic and foreign tourist visits in 2025.

For domestic tourist visits, the top five States were Uttar Pradesh (155.74 crore; 36.3%), Tamil Nadu (36.30 crore, 8.5%), Andhra Pradesh (35.39 crore; 8.3%), Karnataka (32.05 crore; 7.5%) and West Bengal (29.43 crore, 6.9%). Together, these States accounted for 67.40% of the total domestic tourist visits in the country.

In the case of foreign tourist visits, the leading States were Uttar Pradesh (0.45 crore, 17.8%), Maharashtra (0.45 crore; 17.8%), West Bengal (0.4 crore; 15.8%), Delhi (0.24 crore; 9.6%) and Gujarat (0.23; 9.3%). Collectively, these five States/UTs attracted 70.3% of the total foreign tourist visits during 2025.

4.2. Visitors to Centrally Protected Ticketed Monuments

The statistics on number of visitors to Centrally Protected Monuments of Archeological monuments are maintained by the office of the Director General, Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), based on the records of number of tickets sold at the monuments to both Indian and foreign nationals.

For the purpose of conserving and managing centrally protected monuments and archaeological sites, the country has been divided into 33 regional administrative units, known as ASI Circles. The headquarter office of ASI consolidates the visitors' statistics received from different circles and provides the same to the Ministry of Tourism.

Among all the monuments, Taj Mahal, Agra (5.35 million) was the most visited monument in 2025 for domestic visitors, followed by Sun Temple, Konark (3.42 million) and Qutub Minar (3.15 million).

In respect of foreign visitors, Taj Mahal, Agra (0.55 million) was the most visited monument in 2025, followed by Agra Fort (0.23 million) and Qutub Minar (0.23 million).

Top 10 Most Visited Centrally Protected Ticketed ASI Monuments by Domestic Visitors vs Foreign Visitors (2025-26)

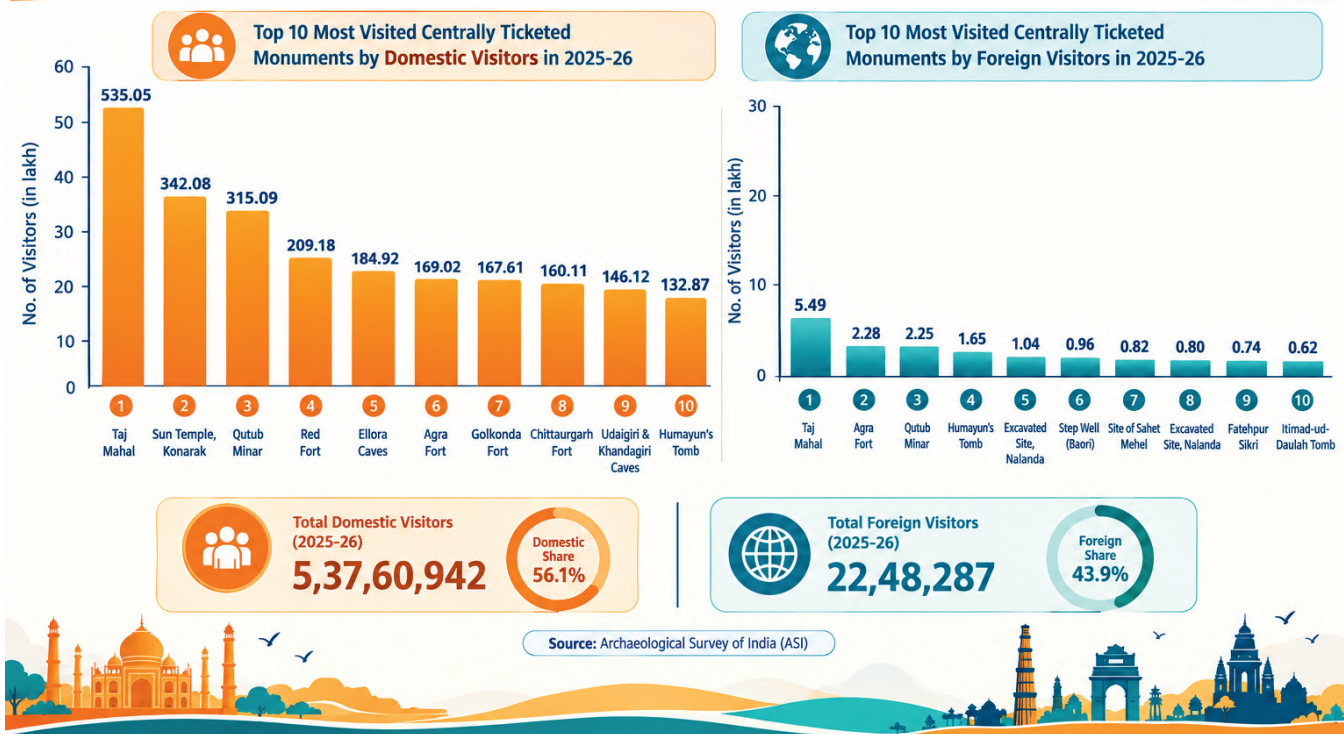

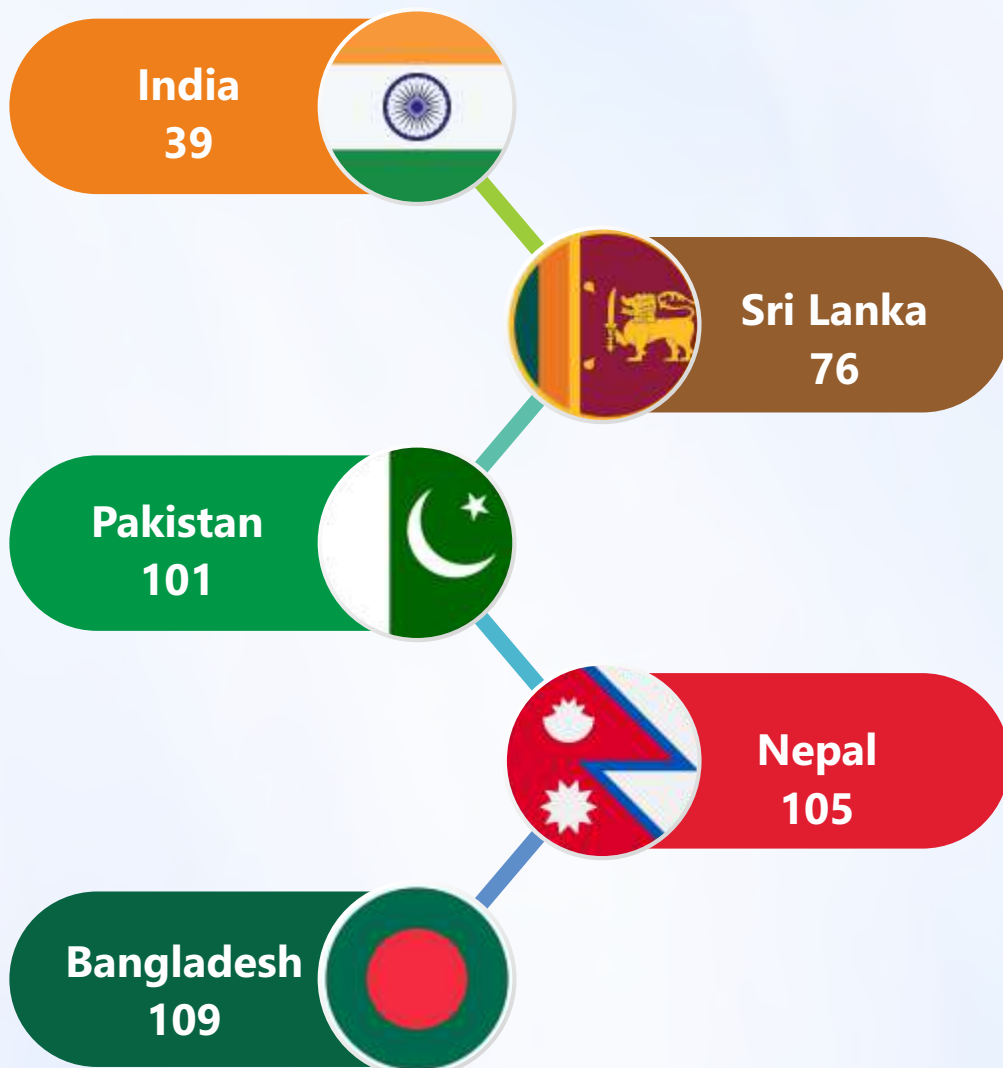

5.1 TRAVEL AND TOURISM DEVELOPMENT INDEX 2024

Travel and Tourism Development Index (TTDI) is a biennial publication of the World Economic Forum (WEF) which evaluates the travel and tourism (T&T) competitiveness of economies and measures the set of factors that enable the sustainable development of the T&T sector of a country. The TTDI 2024 is prepared jointly with the University of Surrey.

As per WEF, TTDI 2024 introduced several improvements and methodology changes designed to benefit from newly available data and to make the index more T&T-specific, concise, and consistent in economy coverage. Therefore, this release of the index includes recalculated 2019 and 2021 figures based on adjustments to ensure comparability. Consequently, TTDI results for 2019, 2021 and 2024 provided are based on the TTDI 2024 indicators. The TTDI 2024 has ranked 119 economies wherein India's position is as below:

Travel and Tourism Development Index, TTDI – 2024, comprises of 5 Dimensions, 17 Pillars and 102 Indicators distributed among the different pillars. The 17 pillars comprise of 102 indicators that are calculated based on the data derived from the Executive Opinion Survey (the Survey) and the quantitative data.

18 out of 102 indicators are based on Executive Opinion Survey (EOS). The survey data is derived from responses to the World Economic Forum's Executive Opinion Survey and ranges in value from 1 (worst) to 7 (best).

The remaining 84 indicators are based on hard data (secondary data) collected from various sources and are normalized to a 1 (worst) to 7 (best) scale to align them with the Executive Opinion Survey's results.

The overall TTDI score is computed through successive aggregations of scores, from the indicator level (e.g. the lowest, most disaggregated level) through the Pillar level, using a simple average (i.e. the arithmetic mean) to combine the components. Scores on each indicator are first normalized and rated on a common scale.

Major methodological changes happened in TTDI 2024 edition in comparison to TTDI 2021 edition. Details are as follows:

1. Sub-Indices renamed as Dimensions wherein two Dimensions are renamed:
 - a. Infrastructure renamed as Infrastructure and Services.
 - b. T&T Demand Drivers renamed as T&T Resources.
2. Indicators reduced from 112 to 102.
3. Countries figures are re-evaluated for 2019 and 2021 for compatibility with 2024.
4. Openness to T&T pillar replaced International Openness
5. Concepts related to financial & trade openness have been moved from International Openness to Business Environment pillar.
6. T&T Socioeconomic Impact pillar replaces Socioeconomic Resilience and Conditions pillar.
7. T&T Demand Sustainability pillar replaces T&T Demand Pressure and Impact pillar

8. Labour-related indicators and general socioeconomic concepts covered by the former Socioeconomic Resilience and Conditions pillar have been moved in Human Resources and Labour Market pillar.

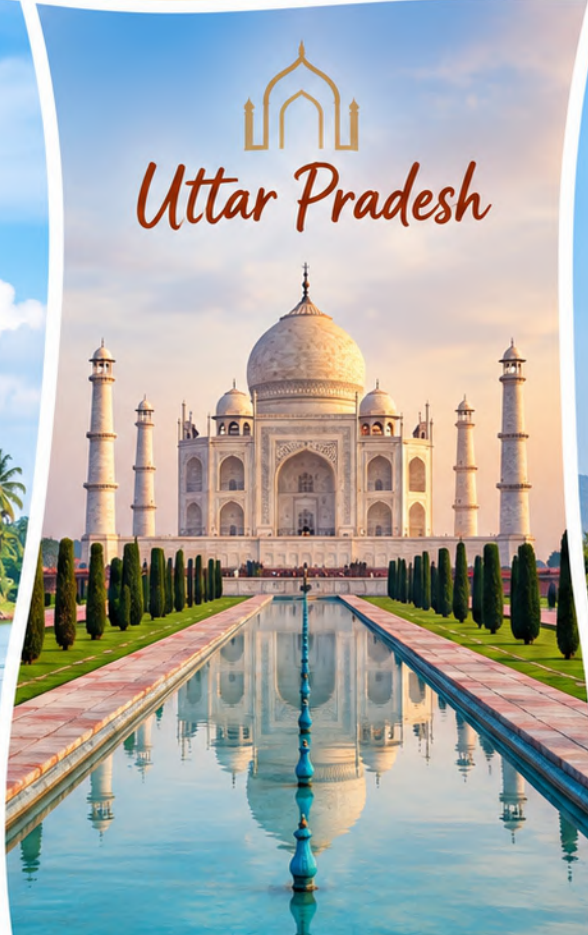

6.1 STPF Brief

Tourism is a vital engine of growth, employment, regional development and cultural exchange in India. To strengthen this potential, the Ministry of Tourism has developed the State Tourism Performance Framework (STPF), a comprehensive and evidence-based assessment that benchmarks States and Union Territories on the strength, readiness and effectiveness of their tourism ecosystem. Built on 12 Domains and 27 quantifiable indicators, based entirely on administrative data, the Framework provides a clear, transparent and comparable picture of tourism infrastructure, accessibility, governance, safety, services, sustainability, inclusiveness and visitor readiness across the country.

The Framework is designed as a Composite Index, enabling structured assessment through well-defined Domains supported by tourism-oriented indicators. These Domains cover critical areas such as air and ground connectivity, leisure and cultural resources, governance, institutional capacity, health and hygiene, inclusive tourism, economic sustainability and tourist services. Together, they present a holistic, balanced and realistic view of how effectively States and Union Territories (UTs) are performing in tourism development and management. The domains and the number of indicators under each domain are presented in Table 6.1 below:

The overall rankings reflect consolidated performance across all domains. Goa, Maharashtra, Kerala, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal emerge as leading performers, demonstrating balanced strengths across resources, infrastructure, governance, safety, and economic outcomes. Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan follow closely, while Union Territories such as Chandigarh, Delhi, and Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu perform strongly due to advantages in connectivity, urban services, and service delivery. The State and UT wise Rankings may be referred in the table below for the baseline assessment. The results also highlight promising emerging States and UTs with clear scope for improvement through targeted interventions.

7.1 Introduction

With the growing recognition of tourism as a source of employment generating growth in the country, improved understanding of what tourism is, its role in the economy and its relationship to other parts of the economy is important. The Tourism Satellite Account (TSA) is a framework adopted by the United Nations Statistical Commission that provides an important platform towards forging improved understanding of the structure and role of tourism in the economy. In the context of national accounts, the activity of tourism remains difficult to define and measure. Therefore, there is little room for organizing data into a structure that permits examination and analysis by function. In such cases, where the core System of National Accounts (SNA) do not provide the required information, there is an ostensible need for the development of satellite accounts within the framework, concepts, and definitions of SNA. These satellite accounts draw from the core accounts in concept, framework and data but are recast to highlight a particular aspect of the economy that may not be adequately described. One such aspect, tourism, is presented in the Tourism Satellite Account (TSA), and is hence the most comprehensive way of measuring the economic importance of tourism in an economy. The Tourism Satellite Account (TSA) measures the economic importance of tourism in national or sub-national economies. It is an accounting procedure designed to measure goods and services associated with the activity of tourism undertaken within the boundary of a country or a region or a state.

TSA comprises a set of tables and is mainly descriptive in nature. It helps in assessing the size and contribution of tourism to the economy. It provides accounts and tables and macroeconomic aggregates, principal among them being the Gross Value Added of the Tourism Industry (GVATI), Tourism Direct Gross Value Added (TDGVA) and Tourism Direct Gross Domestic Product (TDGDP).

The preparation of TSA requires data on tourism-related goods and services, from both the demand and supply sides. The demand side data are collected through the domestic and international tourism surveys, which capture information on tourism expenditure. The supply side data relates to the data coming from the producers or suppliers of tourism goods and services. These are obtained from the Supply and Use Tables. The consolidation of demand side and supply side data is the core element of TSA as it derives the tourism industry ratios or extracts the tourism component from the goods and services which are considered to be closely related to tourism but are consumed by both tourists and non-tourists.

7.2 TSA Preparation

Ministry of Tourism, Government of India, had prepared first TSA for year 2002-03 following United Nations and World Tourism Organisation's (UNWTO) Tourism Satellite Account: Recommended Methodological Framework 2000 (RMF: 2000). The methodological and conceptual basis for TSA, 2009-10 was TSA: RMF 2008 and IRTS 2008. The second and third Tourism Satellite Account for India (TSAI) has been compiled for the year 2009-10 and 2015-16 respectively, in conceptual compliance with the recommended methodology of the United



Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO) as provided in TSA: RMF 2008 and on the basis of International Recommendations for Tourism Statistics 2008 (IRTS 2008). Ministry of Tourism also prepared regional TSAs for all the States/UTs of India for year 2009-10 and for year 2015-16.

Glossary

A	
Arrivals	The data presented in this publication refer to the number of arrivals of tourists/visitors and not to the number of persons. An individual who makes multiple trips to the country is counted each time as a new arrival. This is also true in the case of Indian nationals' departure.
Archaeological Survey of India (ASI)	A Government of India organization for archaeological research and protection of cultural heritage in India. ASI is entrusted with the responsibility to protect, conserve, discover and maintain India's most cherished tangible and intangible heritage.
B	
Balance of Payments	The balance of payments (BoP) Statistics in India is a systematic record of India's international economic transactions of residents with the rest of the world on account of merchandise, services, unrequited transfers and transfers of capital. The Reserve Bank of India periodically releases the BoP data through its Press Release.
D	
Destination	The main destination of a tourism trip is defined as the place visited that is central to the decision to take the trip.
Domestic Travel	Travel within a country by residents is called domestic travel. Those who undertake domestic travel are called Domestic Travellers .
Domestic Tourist	A domestic tourist is a person who travels within the country to a place other than his usual place of residence and stays at hotels or other accommodation establishments run on commercial basis or in Dharamshalas/Sarais/Musafirkhanas/Agrashalas/Choultries etc. for a duration of not less than 24 hours or one night and for not more than 12 months at a time for any of the following purposes: Pleasure (Holiday, Leisure, sports etc.), Religious & Social Functions, Business conferences & meetings, Education and Medical. The following are not treated as domestic tourists: - Persons arriving with or without a contract to take up an occupation or engage in activities remunerated from within the State/Centre. - Persons coming to establish more or less permanent residence in the State/ Centre. - Persons visiting their hometowns or native places on leave or a short visit for meeting relations and friends, attending social and religious functions etc. and staying in their own homes or with relatives and friends and not using any sightseeing facilities. - Foreign resident in India.

Excursionist (Same Day Visitor)	A Visitor in accordance with the foregoing definition and staying less than 24-hours in the country is treated as a “Same Day Visitor” or “Excursionist”.

Foreign Exchange Earnings/Tourism Receipts	These are receipts of the country as a result of consumption expenditure, i.e. payments made for goods and services acquired, by foreign visitors in the economy out of foreign currency brought by them.
Foreign Tourist	A foreign tourist is a person visiting a country on a foreign passport, staying at least 24-hours in the country, for any main purpose (business, leisure or other personal purpose) other than to be employed by a resident entity in the country or place visited. Following is not considered as a foreign tourist: i. Persons coming to establish residence in the country ii. “Same Day Visitors” i.e. temporary visitors staying less than 24-hours in the country (including travellers on Cruises).

Inbound Travel	Travel to a country by non-residents is called inbound travel. Those who undertake inbound travel are called Inbound Travellers .
Indian Nationals’ Arrival	Arrivals of Indian nationals, residing outside the country, in India for purposes such as business, education, leisure and holidays, pilgrimage, etc.
International Visitor	Any person who travels to a country other than that in which is his/her usual residence, but outside his/her usual environment, for a period not exceeding 12 months and whose main purpose of visit is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the country visited.
Indian Nationals’ Departures	Departure of Indian residents from India to destinations outside the country for purposes such as business, education, leisure and holidays, pilgrimage, etc.

Outbound Travel	Travel outside a country by residents is called outbound travel. Those who undertake outbound travel are called Outbound Travellers .

Ports	Ports are the points of entry of foreign visitors into India.
Purpose of Tourism Trip	The main purpose of a tourism trip is defined as the purpose in the absence of which the trip would not have taken place. Purpose includes mainly nine categories namely, Business & Professional, Holidays, leisure & recreation, Visiting friends & relatives, Education & training, Health & medical care, Religion/pilgrimages, Shopping and Transit.

Regions	The regional classification of countries, used for the presentation of data in the publication, is as follows: 1. Africa comprises the continent of Africa including, Egypt and the adjoining islands. 2. Oceania includes Australia, New Zealand, Fiji and the Pacific Island groups like French Polynesia, Papua New Guinea, New Caledonia etc. 3. East Asia comprises China, Hongkong, Japan, Korea (Republic of), Macau, etc. 4. Middle East countries in the Middle East including Turkey, Cyprus and Persian Gulf countries excluding Iran. 5. South Asia includes Iran, Afghanistan, Sri Lanka, Maldives and countries of the Indian sub-continent. 6. South East Asia comprises countries of Indo-China including Myanmar & ASEAN countries. 7. North America includes Canada and the USA. 8. Central and South America comprises countries in the Central and South America, and the Caribbean Islands. 9. Eastern Europe comprises all the countries of former Soviet Union, Yugoslavia, Czech, Slovakia, Hungary, Poland, etc. 10. Western Europe includes all the countries of Europe excluding East European countries, Turkey and Cyprus.

Travel item (in Balance of Payments):	Travel is an item of the goods and services account of the balance of payments: travel credits cover goods and services for own use or to give away acquired from an economy by non-residents during visits to that economy. Travel debits cover goods and services for own use or to give away acquired from other economies by residents during visits to other economies.
Travel/Traveller	Travel refers to the activity of travellers. A traveller is someone who moves between different geographic locations for any purpose and any duration.
Trip	A trip refers to the travel by a person from the time of departure from his usual residence until he/she returns: it thus refers to a round trip. A trip is made up of visits to different places. An inbound trip will correspond to the travel between arriving in a country and leaving, whereas a domestic trip or an outbound trip will correspond to the travel between leaving the place of residence and returning. A domestic trip has a main destination in the country of residence of the traveller, while an outbound trip has a main destination outside this country

Tourism	Tourism refers to the activity of visitors
Tourism Satellite Account	A Tourism Satellite Account (TSA) is an internationally accepted statistical framework that measures the economic contribution of tourism to a country's economy. It integrates tourism-related data with the national accounts system to estimate indicators such as tourism's contribution to GDP, employment, gross value added, and consumption. TSA helps policymakers understand the size, structure, and economic impact of the tourism sector and supports evidence-based tourism planning and policy formulation.
Tourism Sector	The tourism sector, as contemplated in the TSA, is the cluster of production units in different industries that provide consumption goods and services demanded by visitors. Such industries are called tourism industries because visitor acquisition represents such a significant share of their supply that, in the absence of visitors, their production of these would cease to exist in meaningful quantity.
U	
Usual Environment	The usual environment of an individual is defined as the geographical area (though not necessarily a contiguous one) within which an individual conducts his/her regular life routine. The purpose of introducing the concept of usual environment is to exclude from visitors those travellers commuting regularly between their place of usual residence and place of work or study, or frequently visiting places within their current life routine, for instance homes of friends or relatives, shopping centres, religious, healthcare or any other facilities that might be at a substantial distance.
Usual Place of Residence	The place of usual residence is the geographical place where the enumerated person usually resides. (<i>Ref.: Principles and recommendations for population and housing censuses of the United Nations</i>).
V	
Visit	A trip is made up of visits to different places. The term "tourism visit" refers to a stay in a place visited during a tourism trip
Visitor	A visitor is a traveller taking a trip to a main destination outside his/her usual environment, for less than a year, for any main purpose (business, leisure or other personal purpose) other than to be employed by a resident entity in the country or place visited. A visitor (domestic, inbound or outbound) is classified as a tourist (or overnight visitor), if his/her trip includes an overnight stay, or as a same-day visitor (or excursionist) otherwise.
